"Circular," while it implies a round shape, does not effectively communicate the expansive or comprehensive nature of a city view that "panoramic" does.

For example, "empty" does not convey relevance to the pottery itself, "beautiful" could describe many types of art or ceramics but lacks the historical context, and "tiny" does not apply in this instance, as Delft Blue pottery comes in various sizes.
