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## **Explanations**

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## 1. Which statement best describes PPE usage during deployment?

- A. PPE is never required
- B. PPE should be used only during training

*PPE usage during deployment is guided by a risk-based approach. Policies lay out the required protection, and a threat assessment identifies the specific hazards you'll encounter on the ground. Using that information, you select the appropriate protective gear—the right items and the right level of protection—to mitigate the hazards while keeping you mobile and able to perform your duties. This approach means you don't default to a one-size-fits-all solution like a full hazmat suit, and you don't skip protection when hazards are present. Proper training ensures you know how to don, doff, and maintain the PPE, and you can adjust protection if the threat changes.*

*Stun devices rely on short, high-voltage pulses to disrupt nerve signaling while staying low on average current. Each pulse can carry a high peak current, but because the pulses are brief and not continuous, the current that flows over time—the average current—remains very small. That combination makes the device effective at momentary incapacitation without delivering a sustained high current. So the idea the question aims for is low average currents. A high continuous current would be far more dangerous, and no current would have no effect. The pulsed nature describes the delivery, but the key point is the low average current.*

*Discharge duration is kept brief on a stun device so you can create a deterrent and gain a chance to move away, without exposing yourself or the other person to a long exposure. Five seconds is the standard duration taught in many training guides because it's long enough to disrupt or deter a threat, yet short enough to minimize risk and conserve the device's battery. Shorter bursts, like three seconds, may not be as effective at stopping the other person, while longer bursts, such as seven or ten seconds, raise safety concerns and potential legal issues. Some devices are designed to deliver a five-second burst as a common default, though a few models may offer different settings or multiple pulses that add up to a similar total duration.*

In some scenarios, more protective gear is required; in others, less may be appropriate, always based on documented risk evaluation. Claims that PPE is never required or that it must be used in all cases regardless of context ignore real-world variability and can hinder safety and effectiveness. Similarly, treating PPE as minimal or optional conflicts with risk management and policy.*

Together, they create a lawful, standardized framework that works across different jurisdictions with varying legal landscapes. A manufacturer safety guide offers safety recommendations but isn't binding law, and local rumors or informal practices aren't enforceable. Relying on both formal policy and applicable laws ensures proper, compliant use everywhere.*

This approach triggers the formal investigation, assigns responsibility, and ensures that corrective actions are identified and implemented in a timely and consistent manner. It also keeps the message clear across departments, maintains accountability, and helps meet regulatory or policy requirements. While promptly documenting details and preserving evidence are important parts of the process, they work best when they're done within the formal reporting route. Without supervisor notification and timing, important information can be lost or miscommunicated, and the incident may not receive the necessary oversight or follow-up. Filing a personal incident report without informing a supervisor bypasses the proper chain of command, which can lead to gaps in accountability and potential policy or legal issues. So, following the official reporting path—informing the supervisor and adhering to timelines—ensures proper oversight, consistent handling, and opportunities to prevent recurrence.

Uniform statewide regulation of how stun devices are used by law enforcement is what this item tests. 943.1717 was created to address the inconsistent stun gun practices that existed across Florida agencies. By codifying standards for use and oversight in a single statute, it ensures that officers statewide follow the same guidelines, reducing variability that could lead to unsafe or unfair outcomes. This consistency supports safer interactions for the public and clearer accountability for officers, which is why this statute was enacted. The other statutes listed cover different topics within criminal justice and do not specifically tackle statewide variability in stun gun use.

The other phrases don't fit as neatly: electro-neural disruption would imply direct interference with nerves rather than muscles; electro-magnetic disruption points to magnetic-field effects rather than the muscular response; electro-muscular disturbance is very close in meaning but isn't the official term used here.

So Jack Cover is the person behind the practical stun-gun invention, while Tom Swift is the fictional character and Victor Appleton is the author who created him. This connection explains the naming, but it's Jack Cover who did the invention.*
