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## **Explanations**

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**1. The Lumière Brothers held their first public screening of projected motion pictures on what date and where?**

Moving pictures found their first public audience when the Lumière brothers presented a short program on December 28, 1895, in Paris, France, at the Grand Café. This event is widely regarded as cinema's birth because it was the first time projected motion pictures were shown to a paying public, using the Cinématographe to project the films onto a screen for a crowd. The program showcased a series of short films, such as *Workers Leaving the Lumière Factory*, illustrating everyday scenes in motion and establishing the model of public film exhibitions. The date and location are the standard historical attribution; other dates or cities are not associated with this inaugural screening.

A winding key is a tool designed to turn the mainspring of a mechanical device, like a pocket watch. So the best use for a DKA member key is to wind pocket watches.

The main idea here is a motion-picture setup that can be carried and used as a camera while recording on standard 35mm film, using a precise, intermittent frame-advance mechanism. The Cinematographe fits this description best because it was designed to be portable, hand-cranked, and capable of capturing a sequence of images on 35mm film. Its film-advance system moves the film forward frame by frame and then holds it briefly in place during exposure, a mechanism inspired by the sewing-machine style feed that ensures each frame is exposed cleanly and evenly. This combination—portability, 35mm film usage, and an intermittent advance crucial for frame-by-frame capture—is what made the Cinematographe a landmark in early cinema. Other devices in the list don't match all these features in the same way. One is primarily a viewing device rather than a camera; another is an imaging method that doesn't use the 35mm film and frame-by-frame capture in a portable camera context; and the remaining simple camera concepts aren't built around a sewing-machine-inspired intermittent mechanism with 35mm motion-picture film.

Exposure happens at the film gate—the opening that holds the frame in the correct plane so light from the lens can form an image on the film. The shutter simply controls when light reaches that gate, determining how long the frame is exposed. The film loop is only the path that keeps the film moving smoothly, not where exposure occurs, and a cement splicer is used to join film pieces, not to expose them. So the gate is the opening through which the film is exposed.

Open motto describes the motto that is openly displayed as part of an organization's insignia or branding. The other options mix colors not part of DKA's established palette or use shades (like bronze or silver) that don't align with the recognized colors.

Joining two ends of film with a thin transparent adhesive tape is done by a tape splicer. This method is fast and avoids solvents required by cement splicing, which can leave residues, require drying time, and risk surface damage. Components like a pressure plate or gate are mainly there to hold and guide the film during splicing or projection, not to perform the tape join itself. So the device that uses the thin transparent tape is the tape splicer.

While other major cities like Chicago, New York, or San Francisco are prominent cultural centers, the information commonly documented points to Los Angeles as the headquarters.
