This approach not only helps in avoiding overloading a single ActiveGate but also enhances resiliency; if one ActiveGate becomes unavailable, others can handle the monitoring data without disruption. Additionally, this method allows for better scaling, as adding more ActiveGates means that the OneAgents can easily distribute the load more effectively. In contrast, other methods like sequential would offer less flexibility and potentially lead to bottlenecks if an ActiveGate is busy, while random could lead to uneven distribution and unoptimized resource use. Direct connections would negate the benefits of load balancing provided by using ActiveGates. Therefore, round robin is the most effective choice for ensuring efficient connections and resource management in a distributed monitoring environment.
