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Explanations

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1. The TDA monitors Party Line ____.

- A. 0
- B. 1**
- C. 2

The key idea here is that the TDA is set to watch the main, designated Party Line. In a shared communications setup, the primary line carries the regular data and control signals needed for normal operation, so monitoring that line ensures you capture the critical status and any issues as they arise. Other lines, if available, are typically reserved for backups or alternate channels and aren't the line the TDA monitors under standard conditions. So, the line identified as the primary or main Party Line is the one the TDA monitors.

2. Triangulation supports track evaluation, _____, and missile guidance.

- A. Targeting

Triangulation uses geometry from multiple sensor perspectives to pin down a target's exact position and its motion. By combining bearing or line-of-sight data from more than one radar view, the system cross-checks and refines the target fix, which makes the track more reliable. That improved track information is then used to evaluate how trustworthy the tracking data is (track evaluation) and to plan an intercept. With a precise target fix in hand, guidance commands can be generated to steer the missile toward the predicted intercept point, enabling effective engagement. So triangulation naturally ties together reliable track, the decision to engage, and the actual missile guidance.

3. Under FP Commo Control, the system supports up to how many Fire Units?

FP Commo Control is designed to coordinate a limited number of Fire Units in one network, and that limit is six. This keeps real-time data and command traffic within the timing budget the system requires, ensuring reliable updates, status, and engagement orders across all units. If more Fire Units are needed, you'd typically deploy additional FP Commo Control nodes or segment the network so multiple control domains can operate with appropriate higher-level coordination. The other options don't fit because they either exceed what a single FP Commo Control can manage (ten or twelve) or fall short of the capacity it's designed to handle in a standard setup (two).

4. In which Tab do you allow the TCS in the ICC?

You enable a subsystem feature where configuration and controls for that system live, not on the pages you use for viewing data or running the mission. The TCS in the ICC is a system-level setting, so its activate/deactivate switch sits on the tab that groups subsystem configuration options. That tab is designed for turning on or off components and adjusting their parameters, which is why it's the right place to enable TCS. Other tabs are focused on display, monitoring, or mission-specific tasks, so they won't contain the control you need. So you should go to the tab that handles system/subsystem configuration to allow TCS in the ICC.

5. Which option lists the two types of saturation alleviation?

Saturation is about workload exceeding what the system can handle. The two main levers to ease that load are the number of tracked targets (tracks) and the amount of radar activity (radar actions). If you reduce how many tracks the system maintains, you lower the processing and display burden; if you throttle radar actions, you cut the incoming data and updates the system must handle. Therefore, the best choice lists both factors, showing the two ways saturation can be alleviated. Choices that mention only one factor or none miss part of how to manage saturation.

6. How many TLAs can be tailored in tab 56?

Three-letter acronyms you tailor are stored in a fixed, eight-slot area on tab 56. The system is designed so you can quickly reference common terms without clutter, so eight slots strikes a balance between flexibility and clarity. That's why eight is the best fit. The other counts would either limit how many terms you can define (four or six) or go beyond what the tab is designed to support (ten).

7. Which ICC tab combines Data Communication Control with FP Communications Control and Hawk FP Track Filter?

Combining these controls into one tab reflects an end-to-end view of how data moves from the communication links into the FP system and through Hawk FP's filtering. Data Communication Control handles the setup and monitoring of the communication channels. FP Communications Control manages the messages and protocols within the Fire Control suite. Hawk FP Track Filter uses the data from those channels to produce the filtered track data used for display and decision-making. Having all three together lets you configure, monitor, and troubleshoot the entire data path and its impact on track filtering in a single place, reducing mismatches and navigation time. Separate tabs would split related functions, making it harder to keep data flow and filtering in sync.

8. From what tab is automatic launch point discrimination controlled?

Automatic launch point discrimination is the part of the system that decides, based on target characteristics and kill criteria, whether a detected track should trigger an automatic launch. The controls for this behavior are placed in the section of the interface that handles engagement decisions—specifically the tab devoted to launch point discrimination settings. There you can enable or disable ALPD, set the discrimination thresholds, and define the rules that determine when a track qualifies for automatic engagement. Other areas of the interface manage display, sensor setup, or general system status, which do not alter how the system automatically decides to launch.

9. BNSCC stands for which facility?

A. Battalion System Coordinate Center

B. Base Network Control Center

C. Battalion Navigation Console Center

D. Battlestation Command Center

Acronyms for base facilities usually encode both scope and function, so BNSCC clearly maps to a central network operations hub. Base Network Control Center is the facility responsible for overseeing the base's computer networks and communications, coordinating network monitoring, traffic routing, incident response, and IT services across units. That focus on base-wide network management makes it the best fit for the acronym. The other options point to different roles or levels: a battalion-level systems coordination would be at the unit level rather than the base-wide network; a battalion navigation console center would imply navigation duties rather than network control; and a battlestation command center uses a different naming convention that doesn't align with base network operations.

10. The ICC supports the ECM process through three elements. Which of the following is NOT one of them?

B. Radar Doppler Shift

The ability to support ECM through ICC rests on three integrated elements: track correlation, triangulation, and Stand off Jammer Counter operations. Track correlation is about stitching together multiple radar observations so you know when different sensor reports refer to the same target, preventing confusion from separate detections. Triangulation uses observations from different perspectives to calculate the target's exact position, giving a reliable fix in space. Stand off Jammer Counter operations focus on coordinating and applying countermeasures from a distance to defeat or degrade adversary jamming without bringing threats into close range. Radar Doppler Shift, while essential for measuring target speed and movement in radar systems, is not one of the three ICC ECM support elements. It's a sensing parameter rather than a framework component for integrating and executing ECM efforts.
