Penalty clauses that define sanctions for violations often include more than one kind of penalty. In this case, the clause specifies both a monetary penalty (a fine) and a custodial penalty (imprisonment), meaning violations can be punished with either or both, reflecting financial accountability and loss of liberty. That combination—fines and imprisonment—is why the correct choice is the one listing both. The other options miss one of the required forms: fines only omits imprisonment; imprisonment only omits a financial penalty; and license suspension is an administrative sanction, not the stated pair of penalties.

It provides the overarching framework for decisions on energy resources, supply and demand management, and regulatory actions, ensuring policy stays aligned with current conditions and technology updates. While other labels like National Energy Plan, Philippines Energy Program, or Philippine Energy Strategy may appear in different contexts, the official document referenced by RA 7638 is the Philippine Energy Plan.

A valid driver's license doesn't influence whether someone can sit for the exam or practice professionally, so it isn't a required credential for taking the REE exam.

National observances are typically designated through presidential proclamations, so knowing who was in office when the proclamation was issued is key. Benigno Aquino III served as president from 2010 to 2016, and the cited material attributes the May Electrical Safety Month proclamation to his administration. That timing makes him the signer of the proclamation in question. The other presidents listed served outside that window, so they wouldn't be the signatory for this particular designation. Proclamations like this are used to focus public attention and coordinate safety campaigns across agencies, which is why May is identified for Electrical Safety Month in the cited source. If you want to verify, check the Official Gazette for the proclamation's date and signer.

In this context, the official release of examination results is handled by the Commission because it serves as the central regulatory authority overseeing licensing and certification. The Board may administer or oversee the exam itself, but the act of approving and releasing the results sits with the Commission. The President and the Senate aren't responsible for releasing exam results; their roles are executive leadership and legislative oversight, not certification of exam outcomes.

The main idea here is recognizing the law that reshaped how the electric power sector is run in the Philippines, moving toward competition, unbundling of services, and privatization within a new regulatory framework. RA 9136 is commonly referred to as the Electric Power Industry Reform Act, or EPIRA, enacted in 2001. It created the structure to privatize NPC assets through PSALM, introduced a regulator (the Energy Regulatory Commission), and set rules for unbundling generation, transmission, and distribution to foster competition and ensure reliable, affordable power. The other RA numbers correspond to different statutes, not this reform act, so RA 9136 uniquely matches the description.

Continuing Professional Education is the ongoing learning professionals undertake to keep their licenses current and their skills sharp after they start practicing. In regulations like RA 7920, professionals are expected to participate in ongoing training—to stay up-to-date with new standards, methods, technology, and ethical practices. This helps ensure safer, more competent practice across the field. The other options aren't standard terms used in licensure contexts: Continuing Personal Education isn't a recognized phrase, a Certified Professional Examination describes a one-time test, and Comprehensive Professional Ethics sounds like a subject or code rather than the ongoing program required for license renewal.

The person who chaired the board at the time the IRR for RA 7920 was adopted is Engr. Rafael F. Florentino. His chairmanship aligns with the period when those implementing rules were finalized and approved, which is why he is identified as the leader overseeing that adoption. The other names listed are not recorded as the board's chair during that specific timeframe, so they don't stand as the correct reference for who chaired the board then.

The way this law is laid out groups provisions into articles, each covering a block of sections. When you see ranges like 11-20 and 21-27, they are typically placed in consecutive articles so the numbering stays tidy. In this structure, the sections 11 through 20 fall under Article IV and the next block, 21 through 27, sits in Article V. So these two articles together specify those exact ranges. The other pairings would misalign with how the sections are organized across the articles, which is why Article IV and Article V is the best match.

The person in charge is the PRC commissioner. In the process for filling board vacancies, the Professional Regulation Commission handles the nomination pipeline and selects the pool of qualified recommendees to be considered for appointment. The President may appoint from that pool (often with Senate confirmation), but the actual selection of who is on the list comes from the PRC commissioner's oversight. The other options don't fit because they don't curate the recommendee pool—those roles relate to appointment or confirmation, not the initial selection of candidates.
