Social learners thrive in collaborative environments where interaction plays a significant role in learning, and while an overview can be helpful, it primarily benefits those who benefit from a more integrated context of information. Therefore, the alignment of lecture content with overarching course outcomes resonates well with the learning style of global learners.
