Similarly, references to an increased or specific threat would align with heightened states of readiness and response, such as FPCON Delta or Charlie, which are more appropriate for situations where specific intelligence has indicated a heightened risk. Therefore, understanding the context and implications of FPCON Normal is essential for maintaining an appropriate level of operational security and readiness.

In contrast, air logistics support pertains to the logistical functions related to air operations, including supply chain management and maintenance of aircraft, which is typically a responsibility of support and logistics units rather than electronic warfare units like VAQ.
