Only after ensuring that all occupants are evacuated should a call be made to emergency services, providing them with essential information about the fire and its location. This prioritized response helps ensure the safety of all occupants and allows first responders to be dispatched as efficiently as possible. Other options may suggest alternative procedures that do not align with best practices in fire safety, such as delaying action or prioritizing communications over immediate evacuation, which could compromise safety.*
