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Explanations

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1. Ratchet box wrench: Which feature describes a ratchet box wrench?

- A. Enclosed openings
- B. Reach around obstructing objects
- C. Used with different sizes of fasteners
- D. Easy means of removing and installing nuts and bolts**

A ratchet box wrench stands out because of its ratcheting mechanism. That feature lets you tighten or loosen a nut or bolt with repeated short motions without having to lift and reposition the wrench after each turn. In tight spaces, this makes the process much easier and faster, which is exactly what "an easy means of removing and installing nuts and bolts" describes. The other details describe aspects of a box-end wrench in general—the enclosed openings of the box end, the ability to reach around obstructing objects, or being used with different sizes of fasteners. While these can be true of various wrenches, they don't capture what the ratchet feature adds in terms of ease and efficiency.

2. Open-End wrench: Which statement describes an Open-End wrench?

Open-End wrenches are defined by their open, non-enclosed jaws that grip the sides of a bolt or nut. They come in two common configurations: single-ended, with one open end, and double-ended, with two open ends on opposite ends of the wrench. That breadth of form is best captured by describing them as single or double ended. The other descriptions point to other wrench types—enclosed openings describe a box-end wrench, a 12-point description fits a different multi-point tool, and a combo wrench has both an open end and a box end, which isn't the defining feature of an open-end wrench.

3. How can a user re-submit or edit an assignment in FCA School Tools?

The main idea here is how to re-submit or edit an assignment in FCA School Tools. To update a submission, open your existing submission, select Re-submit or Edit, update the files, and resubmit before the deadline. This uses the system's built-in resubmission workflow, which records your latest version and the time of submission for the instructor to see. Communicating a new file by email isn't the same as using the LMS workflow and can lead to tracking or grading issues. Deleting and recreating a submission isn't the intended process and can erase the submission history or violate guidelines. The option to re-submit is supported, so saying it isn't allowed isn't accurate. Always resubmit before the due date to ensure your latest work is considered.

4. To uncover the author's purpose, consider which effect the writer wants on the reader.

A. The impact on readers

B. The author's birthday

The main idea here is that you uncover the author's purpose by looking at the effect the writer wants to have on the reader. The purpose is about why the author writes, and the clearest signal is what reaction or change in the reader the text aims to create—whether to inform, persuade, entertain, or inspire action. If a piece aims to inform, the intended effect is increased understanding; if it aims to persuade, it seeks agreement or a call to act; if it aims to entertain, it seeks enjoyment. So focusing on these reader effects directly reveals the purpose. The other details listed—such as the writer's birthday, the price of the book, or the publication date—don't reveal why the author wrote or how they want readers to respond, so they don't indicate purpose.

5. How are external app integrations such as Google Drive enabled and used?

A. Integrations are configured by the district without user control.

B. Enable under Settings > Integrations and grant permissions; link Drive files.

External app integrations work by you explicitly turning them on and giving the app permission to access data from another service. The right approach is to enable the integration in Settings, then go through a permission prompt to allow access to Google Drive, and finally link the specific Drive files you want to use. This path—Settings > Integrations and granting permissions; linking Drive files—captures the necessary steps. It ensures you remain in control of what data is shared and which files are connected, rather than something that happens automatically or without your consent. Once connected, you can access and use the linked Drive files directly from the app. Likely reasons the other options don't fit: integrations aren't something districts can flip on without user consent, permissions are required for access and isn't always active by default, and external app integrations do exist for Google Drive and other services.

6. You know two questions confidently. What should you do with the others under a no-penalty policy?

A. Apply the elimination strategy on uncertain items and proceed confidently with known ones.

B. Guess randomly on all questions.

C. Return to questions later and hope for improvement.

D. Always choose the first option.

In a no-penalty test, your goal is to maximize the number of correct answers you can get given your time. Since you know two questions confidently, answer those right away to lock in clear points. For the uncertain items, use elimination to improve your odds rather than guessing blindly. By crossing out obviously wrong options, you raise the chance of a correct guess from the remaining options. For example, with four choices, guessing from all gives a 25% chance, but after eliminating one or more options, your odds improve to 33% or 50%, respectively. The no-penalty setup rewards this disciplined approach because there's no downside to educated guessing, and it's more efficient than random guessing on everything or sticking with a single option without justification.

7. A rectangle has length 9 and width 4. What is its area?

- A. 9
- B. 40
- C. 32
- D. 36**

Area is found by multiplying the length by the width. For this rectangle, 9 times 4 equals 36, which is the amount of space inside the shape. The number 36 matches the correct area because it uses both dimensions in a multiplication, while the other numbers come from using only one dimension or from different multiplications that don't reflect the rectangle's actual size.

8. Which of the following best describes what a summary should include?

- A. The main idea and key supporting details.**
- B. All examples from the text.
- C. Only direct quotes.
- D. The author's personal opinions.

A summary should distill the text to its essential message, capturing the main idea and the key supporting details in your own words and in a concise form. This focuses on what the passage is trying to say and the most important points that back it up, without repeating every detail. That's why the best choice includes the central idea plus the main evidence or points. All examples from the text would make a summary too long and specific; a summary should be brief and focused, not a catalog of everything shown. Only direct quotes would not be a summary at all, since it's about restating the ideas in your own words rather than reproducing the exact wording. The author's personal opinions aren't the target of a summary unless you're specifically asked to summarize those viewpoints; in a general summary, the aim is to convey the text's main message and its essential support, not to inject or prioritize the writer's opinions.

9. Which best describes a spanner wrench?

- A. Adjustable hook: May be adjusted around objects

A spanner wrench is a torque tool that engages specific protrusions or notches on a cylindrical part so you can turn it without slipping or marring the surface. The best description is a fixed hook that fits around a coupling with protruding edges and is used to tighten or loosen it. This setup lets you apply controlled torque precisely where those edges or notches are, which is exactly what a spanner wrench is designed to do. The other descriptions refer to tools or uses that don't match how a spanner wrench engages parts: an adjustable hook implies wrapping around irregular shapes, a hinged hook is more for lifting, and a hose coupling remover is a different specialized task.

10. What material are most measurement tapes generally made from?

- A. Wood
- B. Metal
- C. Cloth
- D. Fiberglass**

Fiberglass is used for most measurement tapes because it offers durability, light weight, and practicality in a wide range of conditions. It provides enough stiffness to keep a straight edge for accurate measurements, while staying flexible enough to wrap around objects and fit in a tape case. It's non-conductive, which is safer for electrical work, and it resists rust and moisture so the tape lasts longer outdoors or in damp environments. The markings on fiberglass tapes also tend to stay legible over time, unlike wood or cloth, which can warp or wear out and make readings unreliable. Wood would warp or swell with changes in humidity, making precise measurements difficult. Cloth tapes stretch easily and wear out quickly, compromising accuracy. Metal tapes are common and strong, but they can rust, corrode, and conduct electricity, which isn't ideal in many measuring scenarios. Fiberglass hits a sweet spot of accuracy, durability, and safety for everyday use.
