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Explanations

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1. What sleeve device is worn by an E-2 in the Navy?

The sleeve device worn by an E-2 in the Navy consists of two diagonal stripes. This designates the sailor's rank of Seaman Apprentice, which is the second lowest enlisted rank in the Navy. The two diagonal stripes are a clear and recognized symbol of this rank, differentiating it from both the rank of Seaman, which has one diagonal stripe, and other higher ranks which feature different insignia. The correct arrangement of two half-inch gold stripes with a separate quarter-inch stripe in between is crucial for proper identification and recognition of rank within military structures.
