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## **Explanations**

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**1. Which CE division is responsible for Communications and Information Systems?**

- A. G-2
- B. G-6**
- C. G-4
- D. G-1

G-6 handles Communications and Information Systems, covering the command's networks, information technology, and related cyber and communications planning. This division is specifically responsible for all aspects of CIS, including network infrastructure, communications security, and information systems support across the organization. The other staff divisions focus on different functions: intelligence and security fall under the G-2, logistics under the G-4, and personnel under the G-1. Those areas do not oversee CIS, which is why G-6 is the correct choice for communications and information systems.

**2. Which element describes mobilization to meet wartime needs?**

Mobilization to meet wartime needs means quickly turning peacetime forces, stocks, and support into a ready-wartime capability. It involves activating reserve units, expanding manpower and equipment, and ensuring the logistics, transportation, and command and control are in place to project and sustain combat power. The option that centers on rapid activation of personnel and materiel and the coordination of logistics to support deployment best fits that idea, so it accurately describes mobilization in response to war demands. Other elements describe related areas like planning or organizational structure, but they don't capture the urgent expansion and deployment dynamic that mobilization requires.

In this seven-element framework, the Marines' overarching aim centers on being an expeditionary force ready to respond across the full spectrum of operations, with peacetime humanitarian actions and disaster relief playing a central, ongoing role. This emphasis on humanitarian response and engagement during peace times reflects how the Marine Corps projects presence, builds partner capacity, and provides rapid relief before conflicts emerge. The other ideas—space superiority, exclusive wartime ground focus, or a narrow wartime-only mission—don't capture that sustained peacetime engagement and relief emphasis. Therefore, describing the overarching aim as peacetime humanitarian operations best fits the framework described.

Within a SPMAGTF, the logistics-focused element is the Logistics Combat Element, which is task-organized to meet the mission and centered on the unit designated to provide most of logistics support. This arrangement lets the LCE tailor its size and mix to the task, pulling together supply, maintenance, transportation, health service support, engineering, and services as needed so supported units receive the logistics they require efficiently. The description that best fits emphasizes being task-organized to meet specific logistics needs and centering on the unit that provides the bulk of logistics support, which is exactly how the LCE operates within a MAGTF. The other descriptions don't fit because they describe an aviation-focused element, a unit that's too small (platoon-sized) to sustain MAGTF logistics, or a unit size (brigade-level) that's far larger than a typical SPMAGTF requires.

The main idea tested is how a Marine Expeditionary Force is organized to provide a balanced, combined-arms capability: ground maneuver, air power, and sustainment under a unified command. A standard MEF is built around a Command Element (the MEF headquarters) plus three major subordinate commands that together deliver full capability: a Marine Division as the primary ground maneuver force, a Marine Aircraft Wing to deliver air support and mobility, and a Marine Logistics Group to handle distribution, supply, maintenance, and general support. This arrangement ensures the MEF can conduct sustained operations with integrated firepower, air support, and logistics, without relying on external, separate units. Describing three logistics groups with no divisions would omit the essential ground maneuver element, leaving the force without its primary combat power. While logistics are crucial, they cannot substitute for a division's role in maneuver and assault. The inclusion of a command element is understood as the MEF headquarters managing the force. On that basis, the description that aligns with how a MEF is normally organized emphasizes having a division, an aviation component, and a logistics component under the MEF headquarters.

Promoting the development of amphibious operation doctrine is driven by the element that handles doctrine creation and updating. This element gathers lessons from exercises, trials, and real-world operations, and converts them into current official doctrine, principles, and training materials. By coordinating publication and dissemination of updated TTPs, it ensures that amphibious concepts evolve with new capabilities, threats, and operational experiences. That focus on shaping and refining how amphibious missions are conceived and taught is what sets this element apart from others that concentrate on execution, logistics, or readiness without driving doctrinal change. So, the best choice is the element responsible for doctrine development.

Marine Expeditionary Brigades are built around three core elements that work together to form a balanced MAGTF: a reinforced infantry regiment as the ground combat element, a Marine Aircraft Group to provide aviation capability, and a Combat Logistics Regiment to support sustainment and movement. An amphibious assault craft company is not a standard component of the MEB; assault craft are provided by specialized amphibious units or ships rather than as a standalone company within the MEB's structure. Therefore, that craft company isn't part of a typical MEB, making it the correct choice.

II MEF is the East Coast Marine Expeditionary Force, with its headquarters at Camp Lejeune, North Carolina. Its primary footprint sits in North Carolina, with supporting facilities and training areas in the surrounding Carolinas. That regional concentration makes the Carolinas the best description of where II MEF is primarily located. The other options point to West Coast locations (Southern California and Arizona; Washington and Oregon) or regions associated with different commands, not II MEF. So, the Carolinas best reflect its main basing and area of operation.

**9. Which unit is described as a forward-deployed expeditionary organization capable of rapid crisis response?**

The key idea is that a Marine Expeditionary Unit Special Operations Capable is the forward-deployed, self-contained expeditionary force designed to respond quickly to crises. This unit is built to operate from Navy ships as part of an amphibious task group, bringing together its command element, ground combat element, aviation combat element, and logistics element for rapid, self-sufficient action in diverse crises—often within days of notification. The SOC designation signals enhanced capabilities for selective, limited operations in support of urgent missions, making it the most suitable answer for a unit described as ready, forward-deployed, and able to respond rapidly. The other options describe larger formations or non-expeditionary logistics units, which aren't defined by that rapid, forward-deployed crisis-response role.

**10. Where is I MEF primarily located?**

- A. Hawaii and Alaska
- B. North and South Carolina

I MEF is the West Coast Marine Expeditionary Force, with its headquarters at Camp Pendleton in Southern California. Its forces are centered in Southern California, with some elements and training facilities extending into nearby Arizona, which is why the pairing of Southern California and Arizona best reflects where I MEF operates. The other options point to locations associated with different MEFs or training areas, not I MEF's primary footprint.
