Frangible ammunition is crafted to disintegrate upon impact to reduce the risk of ricochet but is still intended to be used in shooting situations where projectiles are fired.

For instance, using force merely because an officer feels threatened lacks the necessary justification unless specific conditions create an imminent risk. Intimidating potential offenders does not constitute a lawful or ethical use of force. Lastly, while executing a search warrant may require force, it is not the primary justification outlined in this statute. The focus of the section is primarily on actions in the context of arrest and self-defense

Trying a different type of ammunition is also not a solution in this scenario since the malfunction is related to the current round that has already caused the issue. Thus, the recommended response of attempting to clear the malfunction immediately is critical for maintaining safety and ensuring the correct operation of the firearm.

The glowing effect helps indicate where rounds are landing without needing to rely on audible feedback or the potential delay in observing impacts from non-tracer rounds.
