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Explanations

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1. Diplomacy is best described as?

Diplomacy is the process of conducting negotiations and reaching agreements among different countries or groups. Option A is incorrect because while diplomats must have an understanding of international laws, it is not the main focus of diplomacy. The President can make approximately 8,000 appointments, and 1,000 of those require Senate approval. An attempt to turn people against someone by using unpleasant labels is known as "Name Calling".
