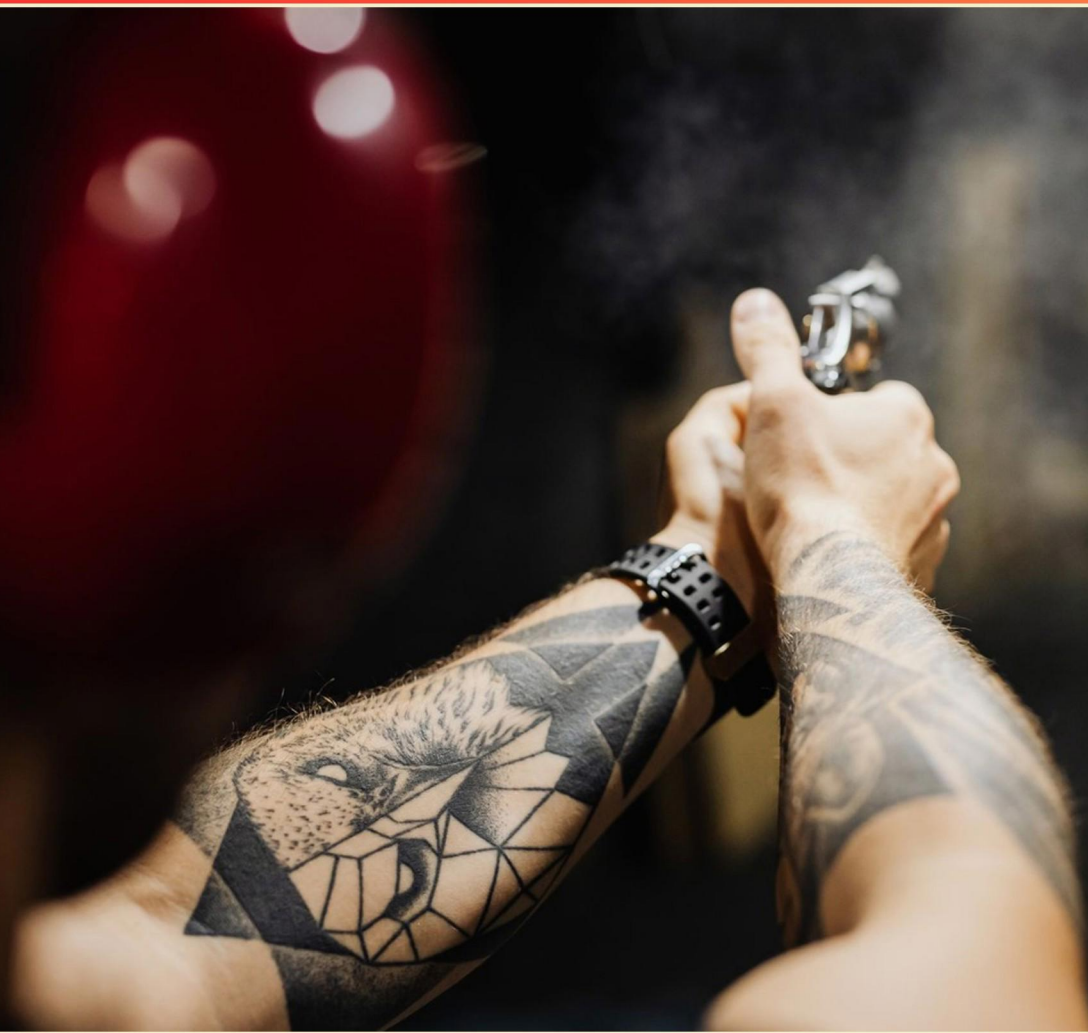

1. Which of the following actions is prohibited under Florida law when carrying a concealed weapon?

Carrying if you have consumed any alcohol is prohibited under Florida law when carrying a concealed weapon.
