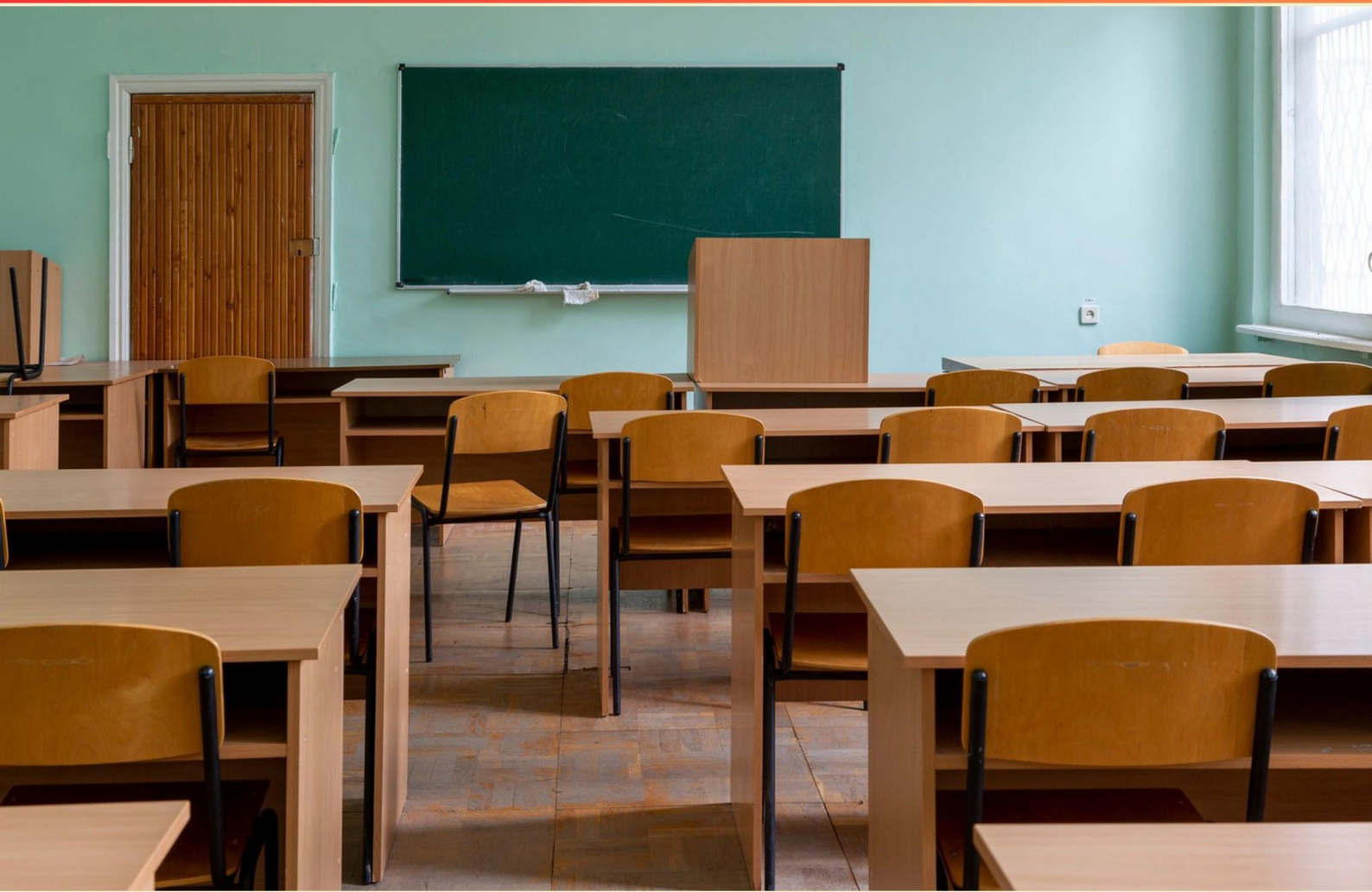

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Explanations

Understanding the hydrologic cycle is important because it illustrates the continuous movement of water on, above, and below the surface of the Earth and highlights the interconnectedness of different environmental processes. Other processes in the hydrologic cycle like evaporation from oceans, condensation into clouds, and absorption by soil represent different mechanisms and stages of water movement, but they are distinct from transpiration. Transpiration specifically emphasizes the biological aspect of water movement and the role of living organisms in this cycle.
