Glassware is also a mass noun and could work, but in this etiquette-style phrase cutlery is the standard way to express that the essential utensil set is fully supplied.

The other options point to issues that aren't the two disruptions the question targets: costs or penalties are financial consequences, and weather is an external factor outside the standard process flow. While unnecessary delays can also be a concern, the focus here is on avoiding delays and interruptions that are excessive, which most directly undermines service reliability.
