Each of these plays a vital role in literacy education, but it is the whole language approach that specifically encourages the use of various reading strategies for improved comprehension.

A flowchart can depict processes or sequences but lacks the storytelling focus specific to a plot diagram. A character map, while useful for examining relationships between characters and their traits within a narrative, does not offer a comprehensive view of the story's structure and events like a plot diagram does.

In contrast, relying solely on intuition might diminish critical analysis by encouraging snap judgments without thorough consideration of facts or evidence. Obtaining information from the internet can be valuable, yet it may lead to the acceptance of misinformation unless students develop the skills to critically evaluate sources and content. Memorizing vocabulary words, while important for language development, does not inherently promote critical thinking, as it does not engage students in the analysis, evaluation, or synthesis of information.

A crystal is categorized as a non-living organism primarily because it does not respond to stimuli. The order of operations is a set of rules that dictates the correct sequence to follow when performing mathematical calculations. When a number is both preceded and followed by an operator, the order of operations is crucial to determine which operation to perform first. In the context of this question, the order of operations (often remembered by the acronym PEMDAS - Parentheses, Exponents, Multiplication and Division (from left to right), Addition and Subtraction (from left to right)) governs how to approach and simplify the expression accurately. For example, if you have an expression like $3 + 5 \times 2$, following the order of operations means you would perform the multiplication first before the addition. The other choices do not directly address the principle governing the sequence of operations in mathematical expressions. Distribution refers specifically to the process of multiplying a single term by each term inside a set of parentheses. Evaluation pertains to finding the value of an expression. Grouping involves using parentheses to indicate which operations should be performed first, but it does not provide a complete rule for the overall order of operations. Thus, the concept of the order of operations is the

For example, when a student paraphrases "shred," they might describe it as "to tear into thin pieces," which helps reinforce the word's concept and usage. This method encourages active engagement with the vocabulary, as students not only recall the definitions but also work to transform the words into a form that makes sense to them. By using paraphrasing, students are also able to connect new vocabulary to their prior knowledge, making it more memorable. While mind mapping can help visualize relationships between words, and repetitive reading could improve recognition through exposure, these strategies do not inherently focus on modifying or understanding the meanings of the words the same way that paraphrasing does. Graphic organizers can aid in organizing thoughts but may not directly facilitate deeper comprehension and recognition of specific vocabulary terms compared to the dynamic process of paraphrasing.
