The statement that the bailor benefits the most highlights their ability to maintain ownership and retrieve their property when the bailee has finished using it, in a free-of-charge context. The literal "gratuitous" nature implies that the bailee does not owe compensation, thus emphasizing the bailor's beneficial position in having given permission for use without relinquishing ownership or incurring a liability.
