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## **Explanations**

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**1. What is the meaning of the Filipino idiom Taingang-kawali?**

Taingang-kawali describes someone who acts deaf to what is being said—ears like a wok or pan that won't respond to sound. The idea is about pretending not to hear rather than truly hearing but refusing to react. The other options don't fit because registered describes a status like enrollment, professional teacher denotes an occupation, and eminent means famous or distinguished—none of these describe the act of taking an exam.

Physiological factors describe how the body and senses influence how a learner experiences information. Because of these bodily influences, many students have preferred ways of learning, such as needing visual aids, quiet environments, or slower versus faster pacing. That's why the option about learning conditions and modalities best matches physiological preferences. Classroom color schemes, teacher personality, and grading schemes involve environment design, personal traits, or assessment policies more than the learner's physical processing and sensory needs.

A quota is a fixed share or proportion used to allocate parts of a whole. This means there is a defined limit or target that divides resources or categories into specific portions. The key idea is that the amount is fixed and used to distribute the total. The other options don't fit because potholes are holes in roads, contemptuous describes a disrespectful attitude, and confusion is a state of being unclear.

Heart's Insight centers on understanding that comes from feeling, empathy, and intuition rather than from pure logic. When insight is described as coming from the heart, it suggests a grasp of meaning, values, or human experiences that numbers and strict rules might miss. That's why the best choice says emotional understanding surpasses rational perception—it captures truths that emotional and moral sense can reveal, especially in areas where people's feelings and relationships matter. The other ideas clash with this emphasis. Relying only on logical analysis misses the depth that emotion can provide. Acting as if data interpretation is unnecessary ignores how numbers and evidence can inform understanding, even if emotion adds interpretive depth. Finally, letting authority determine truth conflicts with heart-based insight, which comes from internal understanding and empathy rather than simply accepting others' claims.

7. In Dante's ascent to enlightenment, what term refers to symbolic obstacles?

Dante's ascent is described as a climb blocked by symbolic forces that embody sin, preventing the pilgrim from progressing until he confronts and purifies himself. The wild beasts—the leopard, the lion, and the she-wolf—stand for these untamed obstacles, representing the sins that hinder enlightenment. That makes wild beasts the best fit, because it directly names the imagery Dante uses for the impediments in the ascent. The other terms don't fit this context: retribution refers to punishment, metonymy is a figure of speech where something stands for something else, and irony is a rhetorical device signaling contrast. None of those names the obstacles blocking the climb.

Attributing human traits to non-human things is personification. Metonymy, by contrast, substitutes the name of something closely related for the thing itself (like using "the White House" to mean the U.S. presidency). Onomatopoeia uses words that imitate sounds (such as "buzz" or "sizzle"). Apostrophe involves addressing someone or something absent or inanimate as if it could respond (for example, "O death, be not proud").

Imminent describes something that is going to happen very soon. This timing meaning is exactly what the question is asking for: a word that signals an event is about to occur. So the best fit for "about to occur" is imminent, because it directly conveys the near-future nature of an event.
