1. On the island of Hispaniola, which country has the larger land area?

- A. Haiti
- B. Dominican Republic**

On Hispaniola, the larger land area is found in the country that occupies the eastern part of the island. The Dominican Republic covers about 49,000 square kilometers, while Haiti—the western part of the island—covers around 28,000 square kilometers. So the eastern country is significantly larger in land area. Also, Cuba and Puerto Rico aren't on Hispaniola; Cuba lies farther west, and Puerto Rico lies to the east, so they aren't part of this comparison.

2. The Hague is a major city in which country?

- A. Belgium
- B. Germany
- C. Netherlands**
- D. Denmark

Knowing where famous European cities belong helps with map skills. The Hague sits on the western coast of the Netherlands, in the province of South Holland. It's a central hub of government and international courts, so it's strongly associated with the Netherlands. It's not in Belgium, Germany, or Denmark—the city belongs to the Netherlands.

3. Which Pacific island country has a large population of Hindus?

- A. Samoa
- B. Kiribati

- D. Solomon Islands

Religious make-up in these islands often traces back to historical migration patterns. Fiji has a large Hindu population because many Indians were brought there as indentured laborers by the British in the late 19th and early 20th centuries to work on sugar plantations. They carried Hindu beliefs and practices with them and established communities that maintained Hinduism across generations, so today Hinduism is a significant part of Fiji's religious landscape. The other islands listed—Samoa, Kiribati, and the Solomon Islands—are predominantly Christian, with Hinduism present only in much smaller numbers. That contrast makes Fiji the country with the largest Hindu population among the options.

4. Which language has the most native speakers worldwide?

Think about how many people speak a language as their first language. Mandarin has the most native speakers worldwide, with estimates around 900 million, largely because China's population is so large and Mandarin is the standard form used in schooling and daily life across many regions. Hindi and Spanish have large native-speaking communities as well, but fewer people grow up speaking them as their first language than Mandarin. English has many total speakers, but many learn it as a second language, so its native-speaking base is smaller than Mandarin's. So Mandarin is the best answer.

5. Which holiday brings a great number of tourists to Rio de Janeiro?

- C. Carnival**

Rio's Carnival is the largest draw because it's a world-famous festival that fills the city with music, dance, and color for days. The spectacular samba parades at the Sambódromo, along with countless street parties (blocos) across neighborhoods, create an extraordinary, immersive experience that attracts visitors from all over the globe. The event is a defining part of Rio's identity, with international travelers planning trips specifically to witness and participate in the celebrations, making Carnival the standout tourist magnet. New Year celebrations in Rio are also huge, especially the fireworks on Copacabana Beach, but Carnival draws even larger crowds due to the scale of the parades and city-wide festivities. Easter and Christmas are celebrated in Rio, yet they do not generate the same level of international tourism as Carnival.

6. The world's tallest building is located in which country?

The main idea here is how we determine the tallest building. Heights are measured to the top of the structure, including any spires, which is the standard used for world records. The Burj Khalifa in Dubai, United Arab Emirates, stands at about 828 meters, making it the tallest completed building in the world. That's why the United Arab Emirates is the correct country. Some projects, like Jeddah Tower in Saudi Arabia, are planned to be taller, but they haven't been completed yet, so they don't hold the record.

7. The world's largest monolith Uluru is located in which country?

- A. United States**
- B. Canada**
- C. Australia**
- D. India**

Uluru sits in the heart of Australia, in the Northern Territory's Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park. It's a famous sandstone monolith that is closely associated with central Australian geography and culture. Because it's located in Australia, that country is the correct choice. The other options—United States, Canada, and India—do not contain Uluru.

8. Which country lies between Benin and Ghana?

- A. Togo**
- B. Niger**
- C. Cameroon**
- D. Mali**

Understanding how the West African countries line up along the coastline helps you see which one sits between two neighbors. Benin is on the Gulf of Guinea, with Togo immediately to its west and Ghana further west along the coast. So the country that lies between Benin and Ghana is Togo, a narrow strip bordered by Benin to the east, Ghana to the west, and the Atlantic Ocean to the south. The other options aren't between them because Niger and Mali sit inland to the north of Benin and Ghana, while Cameroon is farther east, not directly between Benin and Ghana.

9. St. Helena is an island located in which ocean?

- A. Pacific Ocean**
- B. Arctic Ocean**
- C. Indian Ocean**
- D. Atlantic Ocean**

St. Helena sits in the South Atlantic Ocean, far out in the Atlantic west of Africa. This remote island is part of a British overseas territory and lies well south of the Arctic, with the Pacific and Indian Oceans far away. So the ocean associated with St. Helena is the Atlantic Ocean.

10. The Mosquito Coast lies on the Caribbean coast of which country?

A. Panama

B. Costa Rica

C. Nicaragua

D. Honduras

The Mosquito Coast refers to the stretch of coastline along the Caribbean Sea that belongs to Nicaragua. It's named after the Miskito people who have lived there for centuries, and the region has historical ties to British influence during the colonial era. You'll find towns like Bluefields and other coastal communities along Nicaragua's eastern seaboard. While neighboring countries also have Caribbean coasts, the Mosquito Coast is specifically the Caribbean shoreline of Nicaragua, not those of Panama, Costa Rica, or Honduras.
