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1. In which U.S. state would you find Mount Rushmore?

A. South Dakota

Mount Rushmore is located in South Dakota, specifically in the Black Hills region. This iconic national monument features the faces of four U.S. presidents—George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Theodore Roosevelt, and Abraham Lincoln—carved into granite. The selection of South Dakota is significant due to its historical and cultural context, as the monument was sculpted by Gutzon Borglum and dedicated in 1941. The location was chosen not only for its grand scale and natural beauty but also to symbolize the foundational values of the United States. The other states listed do not contain Mount Rushmore. North Dakota, situated to the north of South Dakota, is known for its rolling plains and Badlands, but it lacks the monument. Montana, to the west, features the Rocky Mountains and natural parks like Glacier National Park, while Wyoming, to the southwest, is home to stunning landscapes such as Yellowstone National Park but is not the site of Mount Rushmore.

The easternmost point of the United States is indeed Wake Island. This uninhabited atoll in the Pacific Ocean is located at approximately 12°N latitude and is situated about 2,300 miles west of Hawaii. In contrast, while Guam and American Samoa are U.S. territories, they are located significantly further west than Wake Island and don't extend as far east. Puerto Rico is situated in the Caribbean, but again, it does not stretch as far eastward as Wake Island, which holds that distinction. Understanding the geographic locations and their relation to the International Date Line is key to identifying Wake Island as the easternmost point of U.S. territory.

Virginia is also located farther south on its northern border compared to Maryland. New Mexico, on the other hand, is in the southwestern region of the United States and is much farther south than Maryland, with the northern border reaching roughly 37 degrees latitude. Thus, among the states presented, Maryland has the highest latitude, confirming its position as the northernmost state in this selection.

Other states mentioned, like Oregon, North Dakota, and Montana, do experience cold temperatures, but none match the consistency and extreme lows associated with International Falls in Minnesota.

Alaska and Washington are the two states that share a border with Canada and boast the longest coastline. Washington also has a considerable coastline along its bordering waters of the Pacific Ocean and the Strait of Juan de Fuca, which connects to Canada. While it has a significant coastal area, it does not compare to Alaska's staggering coastline, but combined, the two states represent a large swath of the extensive coastal region of the United States adjacent to Canada. Other states listed do not have the same coastline length when compared to Alaska's vast stretch or do not share a border with Canada in a way that would contribute to the longest coastline distinction. This makes Alaska and Washington the appropriate choice for the states that fulfill both criteria specified in the question.

7. Which state borders the Great Lakes?

Ohio is one of the states that borders the Great Lakes. Specifically, it has a significant shoreline along Lake Erie, which is one of the five Great Lakes. Hawaii is the only U.S. state composed entirely of islands. The state is known for its unique geography, rich culture, and vibrant ecosystems, owing much to its volcanic origins. Florida, while known for its extensive coastline and numerous islands, is primarily part of the mainland United States and is not solely made up of islands. Alaska, the largest state, also has many islands, particularly in its coastal regions, but it includes a vast land area that is not island-based. New Jersey, located on the mainland, features the New Jersey Shore with some coastal islands, but it is not an island state either. Therefore, Hawaii stands out as the only state that is entirely constituted of islands.

9. What is the nickname for the state of North Carolina?

In contrast, the other choices refer to different states: "The Old Dominion" is associated with Virginia, "The Palmetto State" is the nickname for South Carolina, and "The Land of Enchantment" refers to New Mexico. Each of these nicknames has its own unique historical or cultural significance, but they are not applicable to North Carolina.

North Dakota has a longer border with Canada than the other states listed in the options. In comparison, other states mentioned have shorter borders with Canada: Montana has a very long border as well, roughly 545 miles, but the question specifically seeks the longest among the listed states. New Hampshire and Maine both have relatively short borders with Canada, with Maine's being longer at about 611 miles, but when considering the state specifically in the context of the options listed, North Dakota is significant for its land area and overall length. This emphasizes not just the physical geography but also strategic trade routes and historical significance of the borders established in the region, showcasing North Dakota's unique position in the United States' northern tier borders with Canada.
