A country is classified as a net exporter when the value of its exported goods surpasses the value of its imported goods. Other formats, such as open-ended essay and short answer questions, are not as extensively used in GACE assessments, which prioritizes efficiency and standardized evaluation through selected-response items while still incorporating constructed-response questions for a comprehensive assessment of teaching readiness.

This includes differentiated instruction, the use of assistive technology, and individualized education programs (IEPs) that outline specific goals and methods for students with disabilities. While knowledge of classroom management strategies, child development theories, and curriculum design are important for teachers, they are not as specifically aligned with the core competencies required for effectively supporting students with special needs. The emphasis in special education is distinctly on instructional strategies that can foster an inclusive learning environment that addresses the unique challenges and strengths of diverse learners.
