When driving, it is important to plan ahead and anticipate potential hazards. Looking 10-12 seconds ahead allows a driver to maintain situational awareness of the road and its surroundings. This distance translates to approximately one city block or about four city blocks in rural areas, giving the driver enough time to react to any changes in traffic, road conditions, or emerging obstacles. By focusing on this time frame, drivers can make timely decisions to change lanes, slow down, or stop as necessary, contributing to safer driving practices. This proactive approach not only helps in avoiding accidents but also promotes smoother traffic flow by allowing drivers to navigate with foresight. Driving habits that include scanning the environment frequently and looking ahead can lead to a more responsive and defensive driving style, which is crucial for safety on the road.

Checking only at the start and end of the trip does not provide the necessary ongoing oversight of the vehicle's condition. Lastly, waiting until a truck starts making noise to perform inspections is reactive rather than proactive, which can result in safety hazards and additional repair costs if problems escalate.
