Hence, having reliable, scientific in-house testing is paramount when using products that exceed the 10-day mark.

Waiting until the next scheduled meeting could result in lapses in oversight that could compromise patient care and safety. Thus, immediate notification is critical in fostering a responsible pharmacy practice environment.
