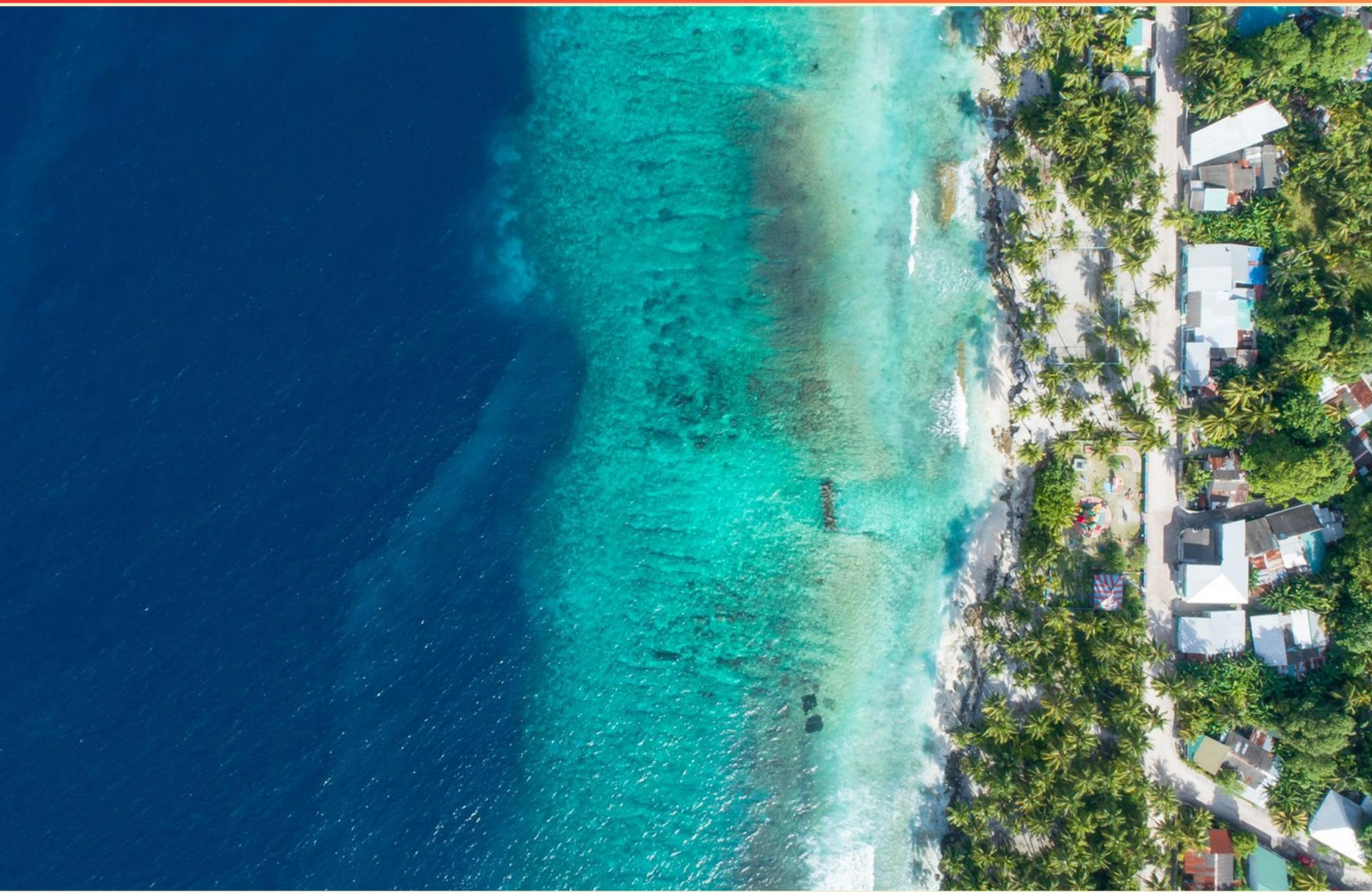

Lastly, relying solely on periodic physical counts does not provide a complete view of controlled substance activity, as it may miss discrepancies that need to be addressed in real time.
