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## **Explanations**

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1. A canceled alarm call for service is classified as a \_\_\_\_\_ per county ordinance.

A canceled alarm call for service is treated as a false alarm because the alarm signal triggered a dispatch, but no actual incident occurred and responders were not needed. The purpose of the false alarm label is to distinguish alarms that do not correspond to a real emergency from true emergencies, non-emergency situations, or maintenance issues. Even though the call was canceled, the dispatch was generated by the alarm system, so it counts toward the false alarm category under many county ordinances.

2. For covert online activity, what is required?

Formal training paired with formal authorization is essential for covert online activity. Training equips you with the policies, legal boundaries, risk considerations, and proper procedures you must follow, ensuring you understand what is allowed, what isn't, and how to handle sensitive information. The authorization step, typically documented in a memo, creates an official record that you have supervisory approval to proceed, establishing accountability and a clear chain of command. Together, they provide both the knowledge and the oversight needed to protect the organization, maintain privacy and legal compliance, and prevent unilateral actions that could cause liability or harm. Other options fail because they omit either the training or the formal authorization (or rely on an informal process), which leaves you and the agency exposed to risk.

When a juvenile runs away from a private home or foster placement, the trigger for referring them to the CSA is tied to age and repetition of the behavior. Specifically, if the youth is at least 12 years old, or if they are a habitual runaway, they may be referred to the CSA. This reflects the idea that older youths and those who repeatedly run away present greater risk and may need protective services and coordinated support beyond what a single encounter with law enforcement provides. Parental consent isn't the deciding factor for CSA involvement—the safety and welfare needs of the child drive the referral. The other options don't fit because under 12 is not the established threshold for automatic CSA referral, restricting to those 13 or older misses the 12-year-old criterion, and requiring parental consent isn't how referrals are determined.

Proper documentation and routing for exposure events is the concept being tested. An exposure requires a formal record that captures all the key details of what happened and then gets sent to the medical professional responsible for evaluating risk and coordinating any follow-up care. The Exposure Incident Report is the best fit because it is specifically designed to document the exposure event (who was exposed, how it occurred, when and where, type of exposure, agents involved, and witnesses) and to forward that information directly to the Medical Advisor. This creates a clear, official trail that the medical team can review to determine necessary medical actions, post-exposure treatment, and follow-up. The other forms serve different purposes. An Incident Report Form is a general record of events in the facility and may not include the exposure-specific medical details or the required forwarding to the Medical Advisor. An Exposure Notification Card is a notification tool rather than a formal medical-reporting document. A Medical Evaluation Form belongs to the medical encounter itself, documenting the evaluation and results, not initiating the medical review through proper reporting.

In incident management, transitioning resources out of active use is called demobilization. This is the formal process of releasing personnel, equipment, and other resources from the incident once they're no longer needed to meet incident objectives, and returning them to their home units or normal duties. It's planned and coordinated so that resources are accounted for, equipment is secured, and redeployment or redeployment orders are clear. Standdown, by contrast, is a temporary scaling back of operations or a pause in active response, rather than a formal release of resources from the incident. Recovery focuses on restoring normal operations and services after the incident's immediate objectives are met, not specifically on releasing resources. Decommissioning involves retiring assets from service entirely, which is broader than the incident-specific release process.

## 6. Which drug has a trafficking threshold of 200 grams?

Trafficking thresholds are weight-based lines that determine the level of offense, and each drug has a threshold that fits how much is typically trafficked and how potent the substance is. Methaqualone is historically distributed in gram-scale quantities, so a threshold around 200 grams marks a significant illegal amount and elevates the charge accordingly. In contrast, LSD is extremely potent and sold in microgram to low-milligram doses, so its threshold is set at a much smaller weight. MDMA is often handled in tablet form or gram amounts with its own higher thresholds, reflecting different distribution patterns. PCP is commonly trafficked in heavier quantities, sometimes at kilogram scales, which leads to yet another threshold level. These varying patterns mean the 200-gram mark aligns with methaqualone among the options, making it the best match.

Public Information Officer notification is about involving the PIO to communicate with the public and media when the department faces events with significant public interest or impact. The best approach is to notify for all major events or any major crime. This ensures timely, accurate information is released, helps prevent rumors, and supports transparency and trust with the community. Other options are too narrow or inappropriate: waiting only after incidents, never involving the PIO, or limiting the notification to minor incidents would fail to provide essential public updates during serious or high-profile situations. In practice, events like a homicide, officer-involved incident, large-scale crash, or other major investigations should trigger PIO involvement from the start, with ongoing updates as needed.

## 8. In a DUI arrest, what action may be taken if the suspect's license was suspended due to a prior DUI?

When a DUI suspect's license has been suspended due to a prior DUI, operating a vehicle is illegal. Police may seize or impound the vehicle to prevent the driver from continuing to operate it while suspended and to enforce the suspension. This action also supports the DUI arrest and helps ensure road safety by removing the opportunity to drive unlawfully. A warning or release on a citation would allow the suspended driver to continue driving, and taking no action would fail to enforce the suspension, so seizing the vehicle is the appropriate enforcement step.

**9. Which overall ratings require the Colonel to review?**

High-level review is reserved for the extremes or the top end on the rating scale to keep evaluations consistent and properly calibrated. Ratings of 1 and 2 indicate underperformance, while a rating of 5 indicates exceptional performance. Both ends require a Colonel-level check to ensure accuracy, fairness, and appropriate handling at the higher level. That's why the correct choice identifies ratings 1, 2, or 5 as needing review. Ratings 3 and 4 sit in the middle and are typically finalized at the supervisor level without Colonel involvement.

**10. Which statement correctly lists the alarm activation details required?**

- A. Physical address, Date and Time of activation, license number and name of monitor**
- B. Activation time only
- C. Address only
- D. All of the above

When recording an alarm activation, you need a complete set of details to ensure responders can locate the site, know when it happened, and identify who was monitoring it. The statement that lists the physical address, the date and time of activation, and the license number and name of the monitor provides all three essential pieces: where the event occurred, exactly when it happened, and who is responsible for monitoring and verification. Activation time alone or address alone misses crucial context, and "all of the above" would imply each item is sufficient on its own, which isn't true. This combination gives a full, verifiable activation record.
