1. Who should be contacted and briefed after discharging a firearm at animals?

Discharging a firearm is a use-of-force event that requires immediate supervisory notification and a formal investigation. The on-call homicide supervisor is the designated point for initiating and overseeing use-of-force investigations, preserving evidence, securing the scene, and coordinating detectives. Reaching out to that supervisor first ensures proper command, policy compliance, and timely initiation of the investigative process. While internal affairs and patrol supervision may become involved later as the case unfolds, starting with the homicide supervisor is the correct first step; not contacting a supervisor at all would bypass essential oversight.

2. Final authority to resolve Jurisdictional Lines Arguments rests with which position?

In field operations, the person who has the final say to settle jurisdictional disputes is the shift commander. This role is the immediate on-scene or on-duty supervisor responsible for directing responses, coordinating between agencies, and resolving who leads a given incident when multiple jurisdictions claim authority. The shift commander can assess the situation in real time, designate the lead agency, and deconflict responsibilities so responders aren't duplicating effort or stepping on each other's toes. A captain on duty may oversee the broader watch or unit, but the shift commander is the on-scene authority tasked with making the live, operational decision about jurisdiction. A judge interprets laws and legal jurisdictions in court, not on the street during an incident. A city manager handles higher-level administrative matters for the city, not the day-to-day field command decisions about jurisdictional boundaries.

When someone is on light duty for an extended period, carrying a firearm and using an agency vehicle can create safety and accountability risks. To manage that risk, the policy uses a clear time limit: if the light-duty period lasts beyond two weeks, the employee must relinquish the firearm and the assigned vehicle to the agency. This keeps weapons secured and ensures proper handling and tracking of the vehicle while the employee isn't in full-duty status. Shorter light-duty periods don't trigger relinquishment, and the standard isn't based on three or four weeks—the cutoff is two weeks.

The main idea here is that the Employee Assistance Program is a confidential support service provided to the workplace that extends to those closest to the employee as well. This means it's designed to help not only the staff themselves but also their immediate family members who may be affected by work-related stress, personal issues, or relationships that impact job performance. That's why the option that includes any Sheriff's Office employee or their family members fits best: it recognizes that both the employee and their family can benefit from EAP resources. It isn't a public service, it isn't limited to sworn officers only, and it isn't restricted to family members alone.

5. Lewd Lascivious Battery involves sex activity with which age range?

Lewd Lascivious Battery is defined by the victim's age being within a narrow range that the statute targets for this specific offense. The offense applies when sexual activity occurs with a person who is at least 12 years old but younger than 16. That's why the correct age range is 12 or older but less than 16: it fits the statutory bracket for this charge, distinguishing it from acts with younger children (who fall under different offenses) or with older teens (who are outside this specific provision).

Photographs used in investigations are a form of evidence because they document facts relevant to a case. A photo pack captures the scene, conditions, positions of objects, and other details at a specific time, helping to prove or disprove what happened. The value of the images isn't dependent on identifying every person shown; even unidentified pictures can support reports, corroborate statements, or challenge inconsistent testimony. This makes them documentary evidence when properly preserved and authenticated. They aren't confidential notes, and while they can be owned as property, their primary role here is evidentiary rather than being testimony, which is spoken or written statements by a person.

7. How many Sheriff's Office members serve on the CRB?

Two Sheriff's Office members serve on the CRB. The board is set up to include a mix of sworn personnel and civilian members, with a small number of internal representatives to provide insight from within the agency while the majority of members come from civilian roles to ensure independent oversight. This balance is why two internal members fits the standard composition—enough to reflect internal perspective without overwhelming the civilian majority. Fewer would underrepresent the agency, while more would tilt the board toward internal viewpoints and reduce independent review.

8. Which of the following is an example of a securely encased firearm?

Secure storage means the firearm is inside a closed, locked container so it isn't readily accessible. A glove box is a built-in vehicle container that can be kept locked and closed, which makes the firearm inaccessible to others while the vehicle is unattended. The other options place the weapon in places that are more easily reachable or not truly enclosed—on the body in a holster, or in a jacket pocket or backpack—so they don't meet the "encased in a container" idea as clearly. So, the glove box best fits the concept of a securely encased firearm.

9. When on call, within how many hours must the employee be available after being notified?

Being on call means you must be ready to respond as soon as you're notified. The one-hour window is the standard that ensures a rapid yet realistic response to incidents: you have enough time to mobilize, gather what you need, and begin reporting to duty or mobilizing on scene without unnecessary delay. If you're notified, you should be able to report within one hour. A window shorter than that, like thirty minutes, is often not feasible due to travel, gear checks, and getting into a reporting mindset. A window of two or four hours would risk delaying critical responses and is not aligned with typical on-call requirements. So the best answer reflects the expectation of prompt availability within one hour after notification.

10. CRB business should not exceed how many days?

A. 3 days

CRB-related tasks are governed by a strict, fixed deadline to keep processes moving and records accurate. The best answer reflects this short, defined window, which ensures timely processing and prevents backlogs. If the task could stretch longer, it would violate policy and risk delays or compliance issues. The other options describe longer timeframes that would exceed the allowed window, so they don't fit the requirement.
