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Explanations

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1. Which ending is described as common in comedies?

Comedy endings often rely on humor that comes from not fully growing up or learning a lesson, keeping things light and cyclical. The ending described—where the foolish character refuses to learn and repeats the same folly—fits this pattern best. It preserves the character's flaws, preserves the playful tone, and delivers laughs through familiar, ongoing missteps rather than a permanent transformation. Other endings imply bigger shifts: a grand celebration and a new life suggests a complete, serious change more common in romance or drama; never returning to the Ordinary World points to a costly departure or quest narrative; changing the world with a single act signals sweeping, heroic transformation typical of fantasy or epic adventures.

The other ideas show up in stories, but they don't capture what makes an epic hero stand out: an unbreakable shield appears in some tales as a tool but isn't universal or defining for all epic heroes; a distant prophecy concerns fate and what might happen rather than a trait the hero naturally has or wields; a talking animal sidekick is a trope in some myths but not a defining feature shared by epic heroes across cultures.

The key takeaway is the shift from an old self to a strengthened, wiser self through crossing that dark threshold.

The other ideas don't fit because a love interest's transformation isn't the gift meant for the world, a final battle weapon is a means to reach the end, not the return boon, and a map guides the quest rather than being the benefit returned to the world.

10. What event marks the Crossing the Threshold in Theseus's journey?

In the Hero's Journey, Crossing the Threshold is leaving the ordinary world behind and stepping into the unknown danger and adventure. For Theseus, the moment he sails to Crete with the other Athenians marks that turning point: he commits to the quest and enters a realm outside Athens where new trials and powers—like King Minos and the Minotaur—await. Defeating the Minotaur and entering the labyrinth happen after this departure; they are part of the trials within the special world rather than the moment of crossing itself. Returning to Athens occurs after the journey, not at its start.
