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1. What is the result of $(9 \div 3) \times (8 \div 4)$?

To solve the expression $(9 \div 3) \times (8 \div 4)$, we start by performing the operations within each set of parentheses first. Calculating the first part, 9 divided by 3 equals 3. Next, we evaluate the second part, 8 divided by 4, which results in 2. Now we multiply the results from both calculations together: 3×2 equals 6. Thus, the final result of the expression is 6. This confirms that the answer provided accurately reflects the operations: performing division before multiplication, and then multiplying the results together to reach the correct outcome.

'Careful' suggests a level of caution and attention to detail, which is similar to or even synonymous with 'meticulous.' 'Precise' conveys accuracy and fine details, again aligning closely with the meaning of 'meticulous.' 'Thorough' indicates completeness and attention to detail, which further aligns with being meticulous rather than opposing it. Therefore, 'cursory' stands out as the correct antonym in this context.

True or false questions, while also common, are generally less effective for nuanced understanding and critical analysis that multiple-choice questions can capture. So, the multiple-choice format is the most fitting for assessing reading comprehension in a standardized testing environment like the HSPT.

5. What is 2,300 in scientific notation?

To express the number 2,300 in scientific notation, we want to represent it in the form of $(a \times 10^n)$, where (a) is a number greater than or equal to 1 and less than 10, and (n) is an integer. Starting with 2,300, we can rewrite it in a more manageable form. We observe that we can shift the decimal place to the left two positions to get 2.3. Each time we move the decimal left, we multiply by 10. Because we moved the decimal left two positions, we need to account for this shift by multiplying by (10^3) (since moving it left from 2.3 gives us 2,300). Thus, we write 2,300 as: 2.3×10^3 . This meets the requirement of scientific notation, where 2.3 is between 1 and 10, and we have the correct power of ten. The other options either do not maintain the correct placement of the decimal or do not accurately reflect the original number in the context of scientific notation. For instance, the second choice has the base not in the correct

Just as pacifying calms someone after they have been aroused, smoothing out a situation or person tends to calm them after they have been agitated. While ruffling can also relate to agitation by meaning to disturb, it does not serve as a soothing counterpart. Thus, "smooth" aligns perfectly with the relationship established by "arouse" and "pacify" by representing a calming action compared to the excitement associated with "agitate."

The term that refers to an insect commonly found bothering horses is "fly." Flies are notorious for their presence around horses, especially in warmer weather when they become a nuisance by buzzing around and sometimes biting, which can lead to discomfort for the animals. This interaction is particularly significant because it can affect a horse's health and behavior, making them agitated and less willing to perform or work properly. In comparison, while ticks and beetles may also interact with horses, they are not as commonly associated with causing persistent annoyance. Ticks generally attach to the animal's body for feeding and may pose a health risk, but they don't typically "bother" horses in the same way that flies do. Beetles, on the other hand, are not known for their direct interaction with horses and are less frequently mentioned in the context of pests that cause annoyance to these animals. Ants, while they can be abundant, do not usually pose a significant problem for horses in the same manner. Thus, "fly" is the most accurate choice as it directly relates to the typical annoyance experienced by horses.

The other methods, such as last-minute cramming, may lead to stress and a lack of retention, while joining a study group can be beneficial, it is not the only method needed for comprehensive preparation. Listening to music while studying can be a personal preference, but it does not guarantee effective learning or focus needed for test performance. Regular and deliberate practice and review, however, provide a structured approach that has proven to enhance academic performance.

Therefore, profit and loss are opposite concepts; profit signifies financial health and success, while loss indicates financial struggles. Understanding this distinction is crucial in financial contexts, where the goal is often to maximize profit and minimize loss. The other terms—ratio, gross, and net—do not inherently oppose the concept of profit; instead, they relate to different aspects of financial calculations or financial measures.

When a judge rules evidence to be immaterial, it signifies that the evidence is unimportant in relation to the case at hand. In legal contexts, immaterial evidence may complicate the proceedings unnecessarily without contributing to a clearer understanding of the relevant facts. The other options, while they incorporate ideas related to the concept of evidence, do not capture the specific legal nuance of "immaterial." For example, "unclear" suggests ambiguity, which does not apply here, and "unpredictable" relates to outcomes rather than the relevance of evidence itself. "Not debatable" implies a lack of discussion, which does not accurately describe evidence deemed immaterial, as it could still be debated but simply deemed not significant enough to influence the case.
