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Explanations

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1. Which term relates to the computation of improvement potential?

- A. Exclusion Criteria
- B. Improvement Computation**
- C. Upper Body Dressing
- D. OBQI Process

The concept being tested is how improvement potential is quantified in the OBQI workflow. The best term for this is improvement computation, because it names the specific step where data from assessments is analyzed to estimate how much a patient can realistically improve in a given domain. This calculation informs whether there is meaningful improvement potential and helps guide goal setting and care planning. Think of the broader process as the overall OBQI cycle, which includes identifying opportunities for improvement, collecting data, and using findings to drive quality actions. Exclusion criteria describe who is eligible for analysis, and upper body dressing is a clinical task—neither captures the calculation of improvement potential.

2. Which data item would you consult to determine the patient's transportation needs?

- A. Inpatient Discharge Date in OASIS
- B. Medication List Provision to Patient at Discharge

The key idea is identifying how the patient will get to and from care visits. The Transportation Needs data item in the OASIS Assessment is the one that documents whether the patient has reliable transportation, who will provide it, and any barriers or needs for assistance. This information directly guides scheduling, arranging any required transportation services, and coordinating with family or community resources to ensure timely and safe access to care after discharge. The other items don't address transport: the inpatient discharge date is about when the patient left the hospital; the medication list provision relates to teaching or providing meds at discharge; emergent care information covers urgent events. None of these specify transportation arrangements, so they're not the data point used to determine transportation needs.

3. Which term is used when a patient's payer changes and a new start of care may be required?

When a patient's payer changes, the formal term used is Insurance Change. This change may require initiating a new Start of Care to document the patient's current status, ensure eligibility under the new payer, and establish a fresh plan of care that aligns with the new payer's rules and billing requirements. The Start of Care Visit itself is the initial assessment that starts home health care, but the action described by the question—changing payers and potentially needing a new evaluation—falls under Insurance Change. The other options describe specific events or programs (the actual SOC event, the Medicare benefit, or internal policy) rather than the payer-change trigger itself.

4. Which cue-card item asks for the current year?

- A. Question asking for the current month.
- B. Question asking for the current day of the week.

This item tests your ability to recognize which unit of time a cue-card item is asking for. An item that asks for the current year will request just the year value, typically a four-digit number like 2026. It does not ask for the month or the day. In contrast, an item asking for the current month would expect a month name or number, and an item asking for the current day of the week would expect a weekday name. An item asking for the current date would want the full date, including month, day, and year (for example, 02/14/2026). So, the item that asks for the current year is the one that requires only the year value, which is why it's the correct choice.

5. OASIS Data refers to which of the following?

OASIS data are the standardized data elements collected during a home health episode to quantify patient status, functional abilities, service needs, and outcomes. These elements are used specifically to measure home health outcomes and support quality reporting and performance measurement. It's not merely about changes in health status inherent to the patient, nor is it an internet system for benchmarking by itself; and it isn't just a general time-based evaluation of outcomes. The essential idea is that OASIS defines the set of data points used to consistently capture and quantify home health outcomes across patients and agencies.

6. Medicare FFS Claims Data are data used for quality measures from which program?

Medicare FFS Claims Data come from the traditional Medicare Fee-for-Service program's billing claims. Providers submit these claims for services rendered to beneficiaries enrolled in Medicare, and the data on those claims—like services, dates, diagnoses—are used by CMS to calculate and report quality measures. They aren't external comparison data, nor patient experience surveys, nor the criteria used to calculate the measures.

7. The 24 hours before the home visit for reporting describes what?

- A. Item M1033
- B. Day of Assessment**

- D. OASIS Conventions

Day of Assessment is the reference point used for reporting in OASIS. The 24 hours before the home visit establish the time frame tied to when the assessment is conducted, so the data you document reflect the patient's status as of that assessment window. This anchoring helps ensure consistency in how information is captured and reported across visits. The other terms don't describe this reporting window: an item like M1033 refers to a specific data element, Medicare CoPs are regulatory participation requirements, and OASIS Conventions are the overall coding rules. None of these set the 24-hour lead-in to the visit as the reporting anchor.

8. Which code is the alternate code for Influenza Vaccine Received?

The concept being tested is how vaccination status is captured in OASIS using an alternate code. In this system, there is a primary code used when the influenza vaccine is administered during the home health visit, but there is an alternate code used to document that the vaccine has already been received (for example, earlier or outside the visit) rather than being given during the current encounter. This ensures the patient's vaccination status is recorded even when the vaccine isn't administered at this visit. For Influenza Vaccine Received, the alternate code is M1046. You'd use this when the patient has already received the influenza vaccine and you're recording that status, rather than documenting a vaccination administered during this visit. This distinguishes prior vaccination from on-site administration and keeps the data accurate for the current reporting period.

9. Which data item records the patient's language data in the OASIS assessment?

Language data is captured in its own data item because communication needs directly affect how care is planned, delivered, and educated. The data item labeled "Patient Language Data in OASIS Assessment" is specifically designed to record the patient's primary language and whether interpreter services are needed, guiding providers to arrange translation or materials in the appropriate language. This makes it the correct place to document language information. Ethnicity and race cover different demographic aspects, and Transportation Needs is a separate item related to logistics, not language.

10. Which term describes reviewing the patient record to inform decisions?

Reviewing the patient record to inform decisions is patient record review. This is the process of systematically looking through existing documentation—previous assessments, diagnoses, medications, treatment notes, labs, and prior visits—to understand the patient's history and current status so you can make informed care decisions and accurately plan and document care. It's the act of using the chart itself to guide what you do next, rather than exchanging information with other providers or describing a specific encounter. Health Information Exchange is about sharing records between different providers or organizations, not the act of reviewing the chart to inform your decisions. An emergency room visit describes a type of care encounter, not the process of reviewing records. A2121 is just a code or identifier and doesn't describe the action of reviewing a record.
