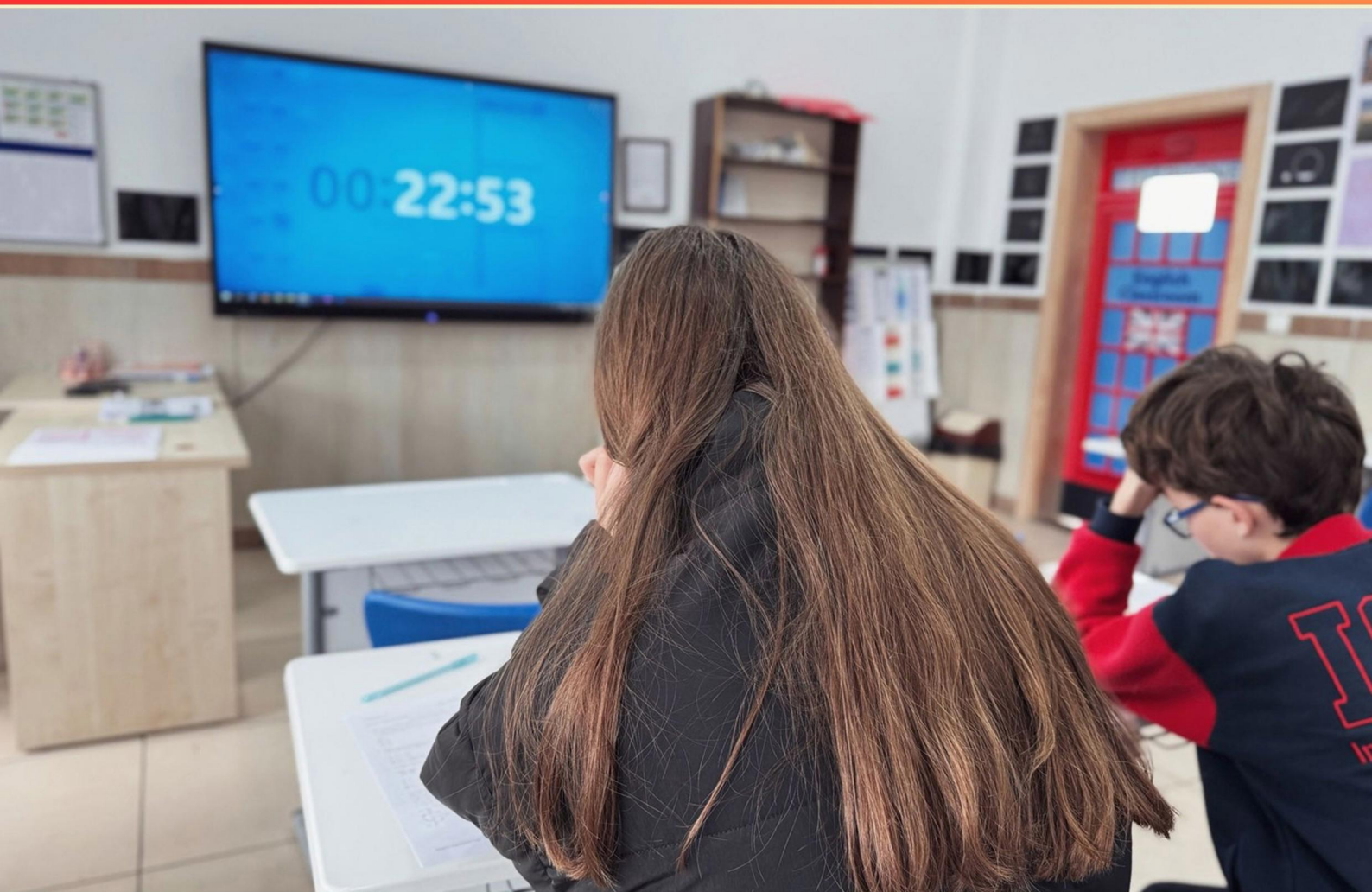

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## **Explanations**

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### 1. Which term denotes a platoon focused on anti-armor capabilities?

- A. Friendly Infantry Platoon
- B. Checkpoint
- C. Friendly Infantry Squad
- D. Friendly Anti-Armor Platoon**

A platoon's name reveals its primary mission. When you see a designation that includes anti-armor, it signals the unit's purpose is to defeat armored threats, using anti-armor weapons and tactics. So a Friendly Anti-Armor Platoon directly communicates that its role is specialized for countering armor, which is exactly what the question asks for. In contrast, a Friendly Infantry Platoon denotes general infantry duties, a squad is a smaller element within a unit, and a checkpoint refers to a security post rather than a platoon with a specific combat role. Hence, the term that denotes a platoon focused on anti-armor capabilities is the Friendly Anti-Armor Platoon.

### 2. What is the approximate firing range of an 81mm mortar?

An 81mm mortar's range comes from the combination of propellant charge and elevation, which set the muzzle velocity and trajectory. You can fire as close as roughly 80 meters, but the round must travel far enough that the weapon's blast and percussion don't endanger friendly forces. With standard high explosive rounds and the maximum practical propellant charge, the projectile can reach about 5,800 meters. That defines the typical firing envelope: roughly 80 to 5,800 meters. The other ranges shown in the options don't match this practical spread—some stop far short of the maximum, while others start too close for safe or effective use.

### 3. What is the M249 effective range for a point-target?

Effective range is the distance where you can expect to place accurate, aimed fire on a single target with a trained shooter under normal conditions. For the M249 SAW, that point-target distance is 600 meters. At this range, the weapon's velocity, bullet drop, and dispersion still allow reliable hits on a single target with proper technique. Beyond 600 meters, accuracy for a precise single-target shot degrades enough that hit probability becomes unreliable. The M249 does have a longer range for area targets (around 800 meters), but the question asks about a point target. So 600 meters is the correct distance.

*In fire support tasks, Destroy means removing the enemy unit's ability to fight. It aims to neutralize the unit's combat power so it can no longer operate effectively on the battlefield. That is why rendering the enemy combat ineffective best matches the defined outcome of a Destroy mission—it goes beyond simply damaging or harassing the enemy and targets turning off their ability to fight. The other options don't fit the same result. Reducing morale might weaken a unit, but it doesn't guarantee it cannot fight; it's not the direct measure of destruction. Disrupting supply lines degrades enemy operations, but it's about logistics and routes, not the immediate combat capability of the unit. Capturing the objective is about seizing control, not eliminating the enemy's fighting power.*

#### 5. Which term denotes direct physical influence over an area or unit?

*Direct physical influence over an area or unit is described by control. It means having the authority to shape what happens in a specific space or with a particular unit—directing maneuvers, coordinating fires, and making real-time decisions. Contain focuses on preventing movement or spread rather than actively shaping actions; a checkpoint is just a fixed point used for security checks; and a friendly air assault platoon is a unit type, not the act of influencing space. For example, a commander with control of a sector can order units, allocate fires, and adjust plans to achieve objectives within that area.*

#### 6. Which factors are analyzed under METT-TC during mission analysis?

*METT-TC is the framework used during mission analysis to understand the environment and constraints that shape planning. Each factor guides what you must consider: Mission clarifies purpose and tasks; Enemy looks at capability and intent; Terrain and Weather examines the physical environment and how it influences movement, visibility, and positioning; Time focuses on tempo, deadlines, and time available; Civilian considerations cover the local population, host-nation factors, and potential effects on civilians and political considerations. The correct option lists these five elements as the standard factors, with Terrain and Weather treated together and Civilian considerations as the final element. Other options either split Terrain and Weather, or use terms like Civilians or Civilian factors that aren't the standard METT-TC phrasing, so they don't align with the established framework.*

## 7. Which weapon has an effective area range of 800-1,000 meters?

Understanding how effective range relates to weapon type helps here. A squad automatic weapon (SAW) is designed for fire support and suppressive fire at longer distances, with features like belt feed and a bipod that let it stay accurate out to the upper end of its range. The M249 SAW can reliably engage area targets out to about 800–1,000 meters, which matches the given range. The other weapons are optimized for closer engagement. Individual rifles like the M4 or M16 are designed for accuracy and effectiveness at shorter ranges, typically well under 1,000 meters for area targets. The M1A1 (being an older, different class) also doesn't extend reach in the same way as a modern SAW. So, for an 800–1,000 meter effective range, the M249 is the best fit because its role and design specifically support longer-range, sustained fire.

Suppressive fire is fire aimed at limiting the enemy's ability to fire by forcing them to take cover or reposition. The purpose is to keep them from engaging effectively, not to kill as many as possible, and to deny them freedom of movement so your forces can maneuver or complete a task. It's about keeping their heads down and disrupting their ability to respond, which can cover maneuvers or the withdrawal of friendly units. It isn't about targeting vehicles specifically, nor is it defined by firing only at night or aiming for maximum casualties.

## 9. What is the M240 cyclic rate of fire range in rounds per minute?

- A. 400-600 rounds per minute

Cyclic rate of fire is the theoretical rate at which a firearm would fire if it could cycle continuously without any stoppages, cooling limits, or feeding issues. For the M240, the manufacturer lists this rate as roughly 650 to 950 rounds per minute, reflecting how fast the mechanism can operate under ideal conditions. That's why this range is the best answer. In practice, actual firing is slower because of heat, ammunition handling, and other real-world limits, but the cyclic rate defines the upper bound of the weapon's capability.

**10. What is the M240 effective range at the area bipod?**

**A. 800 meters**

*The main idea here is what distance you can effectively deliver suppressive fire on an area target when the M240 is set up on an area bipod. Effective range for an area target reflects the distance at which a trained gunner can still control bursts and cover an area with a reasonable chance of impacting targets within that area. With the M240 on the area bipod, stability isn't as high as with a tripod, so dispersion and bullet drop become significant a bit sooner. Standard field guidance places the area-target effective range at about 800 meters. That distance balances the need to reach out to suppressive fire while keeping accuracy and hit probability workable on an area target. Beyond this, accuracy and suppression effectiveness drop noticeably. So, 800 meters is the best fit for the area bipod configuration. The other distances either sit below where reliability is achieved for area targets or exceed the typical range where suppression on an area target remains dependable.*
