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Explanations

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1. Which term describes the overall method of producing goods, from sowing to shipping?

- A. Capital
- B. Processes**
- C. Outputs
- D. Problems

The overall method of producing goods from sowing to shipping is the set of actions and operations involved—the processes. This term covers every step in turning inputs like seeds, water, and labor into a finished product and moving it to market, including planting, irrigating, fertilizing, harvesting, processing, packaging, storing, and distributing. It describes how the system works as a whole, not just the money used (capital), the final goods themselves (outputs), or the issues that can arise (problems). So these steps together form the production processes that drive the whole farming-to-market workflow.

2. What term describes Utensils used in agriculture such as axes, shovels, ploughs, and spades?

This question tests naming the category for items used to perform farming tasks. Utensils like axes, shovels, ploughs, and spades are tools. A tool is a handheld device that helps you carry out a job such as digging, cutting, or turning soil. Fertilizer and seeds are inputs—things added to aid crop growth—while irrigation is about providing water. So the best term for these farming aids is tools.

3. As countries become more affluent, what trend occurs in the beef market?

As people become more affluent, their demand for meat, including beef, increases. Beef has relatively high income elasticity, so when incomes rise, households are willing to spend more on meat. This boosts the domestic market because more beef is bought and consumed at home, whether production rises to meet it or imports fill the gap. In short, rising affluence drives stronger domestic demand for beef. The other options describe situations that aren't the usual immediate result of increasing wealth. An export-led pattern would require a country to prioritize selling more beef abroad than it consumes domestically, which isn't the typical outcome of rising incomes. Import competition can occur, but the primary trend when affluence grows is a growing domestic market to satisfy higher domestic consumption.

4. Which term best describes the investment in machinery that allows one harvester to process 30 tons of wheat per day?

Investing in machinery is about physical capital—durable assets used to produce goods. A harvester that can process 30 tons of wheat per day represents a fixed asset whose value and productivity stay with the business over many seasons, increasing overall output. That's why capital is the best fit. Chemicals are inputs consumed in production, not the assets themselves; research and development refers to creating new knowledge or products; and processes describe the methods used, not the actual investment in equipment.

5. Which term describes the sequence of activities such as ploughing, sowing, and harvesting?

- A. Expenditure

The main idea here is that farming happens through a series of actions that transform inputs into crops. Ploughing, sowing, and harvesting are the steps in the production sequence—the actions taken to prepare the soil, plant seeds, and then collect the crop. These are processes: they describe what happens in the farming cycle to convert resources like soil, seeds, water, and labour into the harvest. Expenditure refers to money spent, physical inputs are the resources themselves (soil, seeds, tools), and human inputs are the people and management involved. So the sequence of activities is best described as processes because it captures the actual steps that produce the final yield.

6. Which age group has the highest HIV/AIDS prevalence mentioned?

- A. 0-18 years
- B. 19-49 years**

HIV prevalence tends to be highest among adults who are most sexually active, because transmission mainly occurs through sexual contact. The 19–49 age group covers the peak years of sexual activity and partner change, so it typically shows the greatest proportion of people living with HIV in the population. Younger groups (0–18) have lower prevalence due to limited sexual exposure, while older groups (50–69 and 70+) often have lower numbers because exposure declines and, in many places, mortality reduces the number living with HIV in those ages. So the 19–49 years group best fits the pattern of highest HIV prevalence.

7. Which country is cited as producing beef outputs?

- A. Canada
- B. United States

Beef outputs depend on the size of the cattle industry and how much land is used for grazing. Brazil is cited because it has the largest cattle herd in the world and a long-standing, export-oriented beef sector. Its vast pastureland supports massive ranching, leading to very high production and strong export markets. That combination makes Brazil the leading reference for beef outputs, ahead of Canada and the United States, with Russia producing comparatively less.

8. Which term refers to any substance used to make soil more fertile, including manure or nitrates?

- A. Manure
- B. Irrigation
- C. Fertilizer**
- D. Soil Exhaustion

Fertilizer is the term for any substance added to soil to boost fertility by supplying essential nutrients. This includes organic materials like manure as well as inorganic compounds such as nitrates. Irrigation pertains to supplying water and doesn't directly add nutrients, while soil exhaustion describes a state of nutrient depletion rather than a substance. Since the question asks for a word that covers manure, nitrates, and other nutrient sources, the best term is fertilizer.

9. Which irrigation methods are listed?

- A. Flood irrigation only
- B. Sprinklers only
- C. Canals from rivers to irrigate the fields with furrow, sprinklers, drip and centre pivots**
- D. Drip irrigation only

This question tests knowing that irrigation systems use a water supply network and multiple application methods. Water from rivers can be carried to fields by canals, and once there, water can be applied in several ways: furrow irrigation where water runs along trenches between rows, sprinkler irrigation where water is sprayed through sprinklers, drip irrigation delivering water directly to the root zones, and centre-pivot irrigation with a rotating sprinkler system. Because this option lists the canal delivery plus all these application methods, it best represents the range of techniques used. The other choices imply only a single method, which doesn't capture the variety available.

10. Which disease is mentioned as weakening the cattle herd?

A. Foot and mouth disease

B. Avian influenza

C. Bovine TB

D. Anthrax

Foot and mouth disease is a highly contagious illness that affects cloven-hoofed animals, including cattle. It spreads rapidly within a herd, causing fever, painful blisters in the mouth and on the feet, lameness, and reduced appetite. These symptoms slash milk production and weight gain, so the herd weakens quickly. Outbreaks also trigger movement restrictions and culling to stop spread, adding to the disruption and economic impact on the herd. The other diseases either mainly affect other species (avian influenza in birds) or progress differently in cattle (bovine TB is a slow, chronic illness; anthrax can cause sudden death but isn't described as weakening the whole herd in the same way).
