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Explanations

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1. What is a common criterion for classifying a detainee as high level?

The priority is to ensure public safety while processing claims for asylum.

In this case, the automatic stay serves to pause the enforcement of the removal order until the merits of the Motion to Reopen are evaluated, ensuring that individuals have a fair chance to contest their removal from the United States. Other scenarios listed do not lead to an automatic EOIR Admin. Stay. For instance, merely applying for a visa, experiencing a change in status, or voluntarily departing does not provide the same legal basis for halting the execution of a removal order, as they are not directly tied to the circumstances of the removal proceeding itself. The specific linkage between an in absentia order and the request for reopening the case is what qualifies for an automatic stay under EOIR regulations.
