It allows users to choose the more appropriate authentication method based on their specific use case, such as frequently accessing from a secure corporate network versus accessing from a remote or dynamic IP. This combination of security measures is crucial for ensuring accountability and safeguarding data accessed via the API.

This distinction highlights why Substitution Masking is aligned with the use of dictionary files for its functionality.
