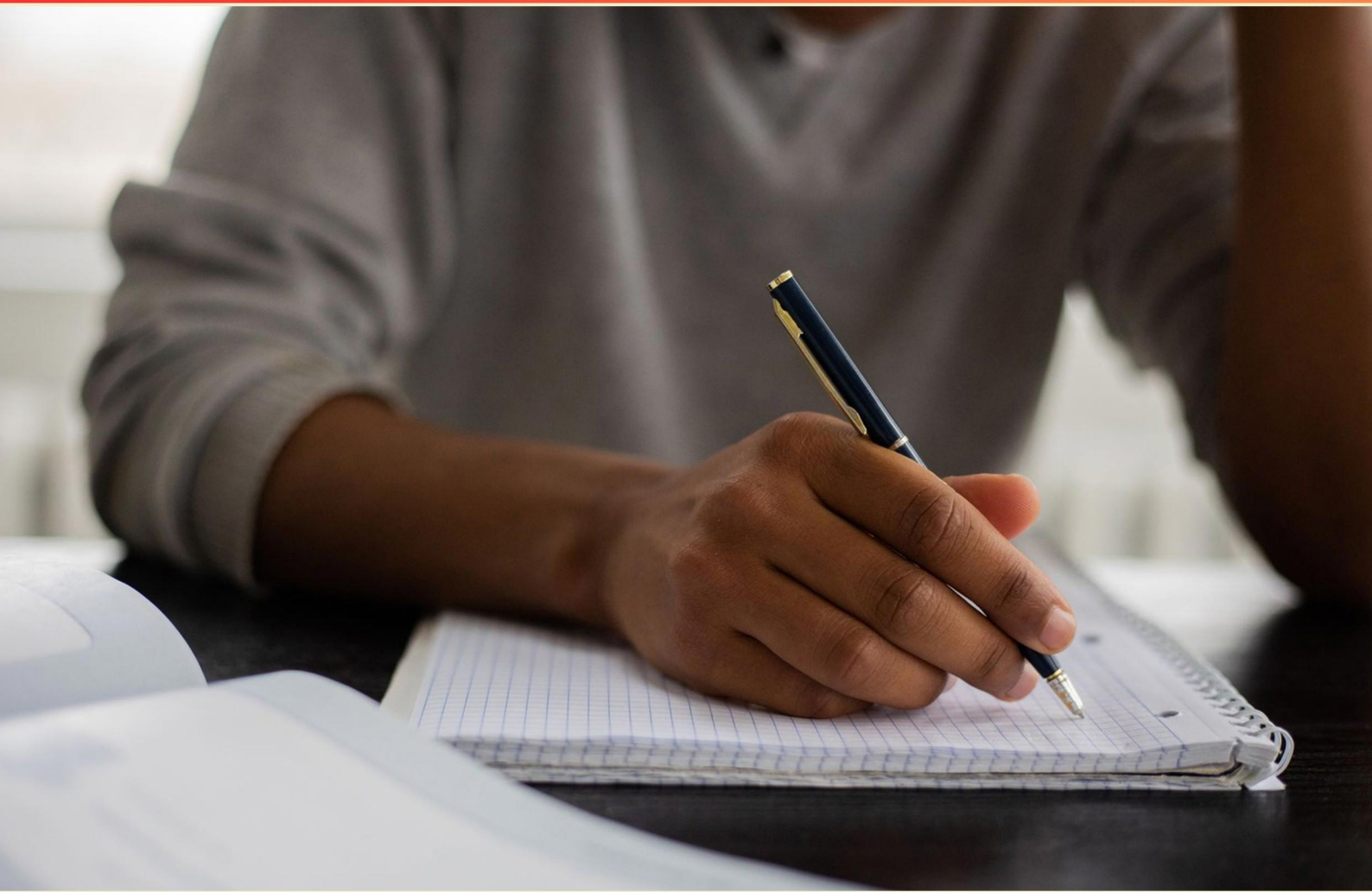

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Explanations

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1. If $x + 2 = 7$, what is x ?

- A. 3
- B. 4
- C. 6
- D. 5**

Solving this uses the idea of inverse operations to isolate the variable. You want to undo the +2 on the left side. Do that by subtracting 2 from both sides: $x + 2 = 7$ becomes $x = 7 - 2$, so $x = 5$. That value makes the left side become $5 + 2$, which is 7, matching the right side. So the correct value is 5. If you test other numbers, they wouldn't give 7 when you add 2, for example 3 would give 5, 4 would give 6, and 6 would give 8.

2. Between 1850 and 1882, the Chinese population in the United States grew to 100,000. Which of the following describes how this growth aided American capitalists?

When a larger pool of workers is available, capitalists benefit by having a cheap, easily replaceable labor supply. The rise of Chinese immigrants—reaching about 100,000 by 1882—gave American employers a substantial source of workers willing to take low-wage, dangerous, and undesirable jobs. This makes it easier to cut labor costs and keep profits up, since employers can hire more workers at lower wages and replace them with little disruption if demand shifts or workers leave. So, beyond their concrete contributions to specific projects like railroad construction, the key effect of this population growth is the creation of an expendable labor force that helps keep wages down and profits higher. The other options describe real activities—railroad work or agricultural techniques—but they don't capture the economic mechanism as clearly as the idea of a readily available, replaceable labor pool.

3. If a sequence is 2, 6, 12, 20, what is the next term?

The pattern shows that each step adds an even number that grows by 2: 2 to 6 adds 4, 6 to 12 adds 6, 12 to 20 adds 8. Following that trend, the next addition should be 10, so $20 + 10 = 30$. Therefore the next term is 30. (Another way to see it: $a_n = n(n+1)$; for $n = 5$, $5 \times 6 = 30$.)

4. Freedom Summer's aims included education and empowerment. Which statement is true?

Freedom Summer aimed to build confidence and leadership through education that empowers people to take action. The statement that they promoted self-worth and leadership captures that goal beautifully. Freedom Schools and related programs taught reading, writing, civics, and civil rights history while encouraging students to think for themselves, organize with others, and see themselves as capable leaders in their communities. This focus on personal growth and active participation is what made the effort about education and empowerment. The other ideas don't fit as well. The movement wasn't about sports; its purpose was to advance civil rights through education and voter participation. It wasn't a nationwide effort in scope; it was concentrated in Mississippi and a few nearby areas. And while it emphasized literacy and civic understanding, it wasn't framed as avoiding any particular subject like math.

Everyday forms of power that reinforce inequality operate through symbols, language, and routines that make the social order seem natural or deserved. This is symbolic violence: power is exercised not by obvious force, but through what counts as normal, legitimate, or valuable ideas and practices. Because these messages are so ingrained, people internalize them and reproduce the hierarchy without realizing they're doing so. Think of how language and educational curricula embed certain histories and viewpoints as the default, or how everyday interactions and media portray certain groups in limited roles—the result is a stable, unspoken sense that the current arrangement is just how things are. This fits best because the focus is on covert, culturally embedded ways that maintain inequality, rather than on open hostility, direct exploitation, or appropriation of culture. Personal animosity would involve explicit dislike toward individuals; economic exploitation centers on unequal financial or material gain; cultural appropriation concerns taking elements of a culture without proper context or respect. Symbolic violence captures how power operates through norms and symbols that appear non-coercive yet profoundly shape who is privileged and who is marginalized.

6. Which statement best exemplifies white privilege in everyday life?

White privilege is the unearned advantages people can experience in everyday life simply because of their race. It shows up as patterns of treatment and opportunity that white individuals often don't have to question or fear. Not being followed in stores because of race illustrates how racial bias can place people of color under suspicion, a risk white people typically don't face in similar settings. Not experiencing being stopped by law enforcement due to race reflects protections and assumptions of safety that commonly accompany whiteness, rather than being treated as a potential threat. Having your voice heard in meetings and public forums shows how credibility and legitimacy are often granted more readily to white individuals. Taken together, these examples cover several common, real-world ways privilege can materialize in daily life. That's why the option encompassing all of these—the "all of the above" choice—best represents white privilege in everyday life.

Felony disenfranchisement laws and their disproportionate impact on Black men form the central concept. Across states, voting rights are restricted for people with felony convictions, with rules that vary on whether rights are restored after release or require formal action. Because Black men are more likely to be affected by felony convictions and incarceration due to long-standing disparities in the criminal justice system, a sizable share cannot vote. Estimates cited by researchers place around one in seven Black men of voting age unable to vote under current laws, though the exact figure depends on year and methodology. This shows how legal barriers translate into real differences in political participation. So the statement is true as a general characterization of the current landscape.

8. What term describes drawing political boundaries to benefit a party?

The main idea here is the strategic shaping of district lines to give one party an electoral advantage. This is exactly what gerrymandering describes—drawing boundaries in a way that helps the party in power, often by concentrating the opposing vote in a few districts (packing) or spreading it across many districts to dilute its impact (cracking). Redistricting is simply the neutral process of redrawing districts after population changes, not inherently about bias. Apportionment deals with how many seats a state gets, based on population. Ballot manipulation involves altering votes themselves, not the way districts are drawn. So the term that best fits this scenario is gerrymandering.

9. Which approach best controls for confounding when evaluating a policy's effect on crime rates across regions?

When evaluating a policy across regions, the aim is to separate the policy's effect from other regional differences that could also influence crime. Confounding factors—like literacy and unemployment—can affect crime rates and can also be related to whether a region adopts the policy. By using a regression model that includes literacy, unemployment, and other relevant characteristics as predictors, you adjust for these differences. This lets you compare regions that are similar in these respects and estimate how crime changes with the policy itself, rather than due to other factors. This approach is stronger than simply comparing one variable (like literacy) alone, which would overlook many other influences. While randomly assigning the policy to regions would ideally control for confounding by design, in practice this is often not feasible for real-world policies. Ignoring regional differences would leave bias from confounders unaddressed, making the estimated effect unreliable.

10. The 30% tip on a \$45 bill is?

A. 16

Finding a percentage of a number means multiplying the number by the percent written as a decimal. Here, 30% is 0.30, so 0.30×45 equals 13.5. You can also see it by taking 10% of 45, which is 4.5, and doing three times that amount: $4.5 \times 3 = 13.5$. The other options come from different percentages: 15 would be 33.3% of 45, 16 is about 35.6% of 45, and 12 is about 26.7% of 45.
