For instance, closed-door policies or prohibitions do not provide the flexibility needed for effective medication management, and a blanket requirement for state approval does not consider the autonomy of institutions to develop tailored programs based on their unique circumstances.

This distinction clarifies why the pharmacy technician stands apart as not fitting into the category of pharmacy support persons.

This distinction is critical in understanding pharmaceutical regulations and the need for careful monitoring of substances with a higher risk of dependency.
