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Explanations

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1. What are the functions of a lead apron and a thyroid collar during radiographic procedures?

- A. To balance the patient during imaging.
- B. To shield the patient's body and thyroid from scatter radiation and reduce radiation exposure.**

Protecting tissues from scatter radiation is the main idea behind shielding during radiographic procedures. The lead apron covers the trunk—the chest, abdomen, and pelvis—absorbing scatter photons that could reach internal organs, thereby reducing overall radiation exposure. The thyroid collar provides focused protection for the neck, shielding the thyroid gland, a radiosensitive tissue, from scatter radiation. These shields don't affect the primary X-ray beam or image quality; they're there to lower incidental exposure. They aren't for balancing the patient, improving image sharpness, or increasing dose.

2. The dentist must make reasonable arrangements for emergency care of patients not of record.

In a dental practice, the obligation to help in emergencies isn't limited to people who are already patients. If someone who isn't currently on the practice's roster presents with a dental emergency, the dentist must make reasonable arrangements to ensure they receive care. This protects the person from harm, relieves pain, and upholds professional responsibility. Reasonable arrangements can include providing immediate treatment to stabilize the condition, offering temporary relief, or referring to another dentist or an appropriate emergency service, with clear communication about follow-up. Therefore, this statement is true.

3. What should a dental assistant do to protect patient information and maintain confidentiality?

Protecting patient information comes down to limiting who can see records and using secure methods to handle them. The best approach is to store records securely, limit access to those who need them, use secure electronic systems for digital records, and share information only with authorized personnel or with patient consent when required. Physically, keep paper records in locked, access-controlled storage and never leave them unattended on a desk. For electronic data, use strong passwords, log off when finished, keep devices secure, and rely on compliant EHR software with encryption and audit trails. Follow the minimum necessary standard under HIPAA to determine who may access information and for what purpose. Sharing information with family without consent or sending records through personal email would create unnecessary risk and violate confidentiality.

4. Which type of consent requires information about risks, benefits, and alternatives before treatment?

Before any treatment, you must provide the patient with information about what will be done, the possible risks and benefits, and any reasonable alternatives, so they can make an informed decision. That comprehensive disclosure and the patient's voluntary agreement is what you call informed consent. It's the type of consent that ensures the patient understands what could happen, what could help, and what other options exist, including what might happen if no treatment is chosen. Expressed consent is simply an explicit agreement, often in writing or spoken, but it doesn't by itself require detailed discussion of risks and alternatives. Implied consent is inferred from the patient's actions rather than a formal discussion. Confidentiality relates to privacy of information, not to agreeing to a treatment after being informed.

5. The statement 'The patient record must be kept at least 3 years after the last date of entry' is true or false?

Maintaining patient records for a sufficient period is essential because these documents support ongoing care, billing, and legal/regulatory reviews, including potential malpractice claims. Three years after the last entry is generally not enough to meet state requirements. In Iowa, the standard retention period for dental records is longer than that; a common minimum is seven years after the last entry, with extended retention for patients who were minors at treatment (often until the patient reaches the age of majority plus an additional period, depending on current rules). Because state laws can change, always verify the latest Iowa Board or statute guidance. So the statement is false.

6. Name two common temporary restorative materials.

Temporary restorations protect the tooth between visits and need to be easy to place and remove while sealing the prep. Zinc oxide eugenol cement provides a soothing effect to the pulp and is simple to place, making it a common choice for temporaries. Reinforced zinc oxide eugenol (IRM) strengthens that base, offering better fracture resistance and a more durable seal for short-term use. Some clinicians also use temporary composite resins as an alternative, but the classic combination most exams expect is ZOE-based cement and IRM. Other options aren't typical two-material temporary restoratives: dentin bonding agents aren't restoratives by themselves, and while glass ionomer can be used for temporary fillings in some cases, it's not paired here with a matching temporary material in the same sense; Portland cement and gutta-percha are not used as temporary restoratives in typical practice.

7. In the donning sequence, which item is worn last?

In donning PPE, gloves are worn last. This ordering protects you and your patient by keeping the barrier steps clean and reducing the chance of contaminating other gear while you're putting it on. Start with the gown to cover your clothing, then the mask or respirator to protect the airway, followed by goggles or a face shield to shield the eyes. By putting on gloves last, your hands—the most likely to touch contaminated surfaces—remain clean while you secure the rest of the protective equipment. If gloves were put on earlier, handling the gown, mask, or eye protection could transfer contaminants to those items or to your hands, increasing the risk of exposure.

8. Which supervision level allows delegated services to be performed without the dentist being physically present in the facility?

General supervision is the level that allows delegated services to be performed without the dentist physically present in the facility. In this setup, the dentist has examined the patient and authorized the procedure, and the auxiliary can carry it out with the dentist available for consultation but not required to be on-site for the actual procedure. The other levels require the dentist to be in the room or otherwise immediately available during the treatment, so they do not permit performing the procedure without the dentist in the facility.

9. If a candidate graduates from a CODA-approved program, what credential are they eligible to pursue in Iowa?

CODA accreditation means the program meets national standards for dental assisting education, and in Iowa that education qualifies you to pursue the Registered Dental Assistant credential after graduation. The RDA is the credential you earn to practice with expanded duties, while the Trainee status is a temporary designation for those still in training or awaiting exam prerequisites. So, a graduate from a CODA-approved program pursues the RDA.

10. Expressed consent can be conveyed in which form?

Expressed consent means the patient clearly agrees to a procedure, not just going along by chance or assumption. It can be given in two forms: written or oral. A written consent provides a tangible record that spells out what will be done, the risks, alternatives, and the patient's signature, which helps protect both patient and clinician. Oral consent is also valid because it shows explicit agreement, as long as it is documented in the patient's record, noting what was discussed and the patient's questions and responses. In dentistry, obtaining informed consent before treatment is essential for patient autonomy and legal protection, and while written consent is often preferred for documentation, oral consent meets the requirement of expressed consent when properly recorded. Therefore, expressed consent can be conveyed in both written and oral forms.
