SAMPLE

1. Which yard is west of Jamaica Station and north of the westbound Montauk?

- A. Receiving Yard is east of Jamaica Station, north of the westbound Montauk
- B. Receiving Yard is west of Jamaica Station, south of the westbound Montauk
- C. Receiving Yard is west of Jamaica Station, north of the westbound Montauk**
- D. Receiving Yard is north of Jamaica Station and west of Montauk

Two-dimensional spatial relationships are tested here: identify a location by its relation to Jamaica Station and by its relation to the westbound Montauk line. The Receiving Yard is described as being west of Jamaica Station, which means it sits to the left of Jamaica on the map. It's also described as being north of the westbound Montauk, so it lies above the track representing westbound Montauk trains. When you combine both clues, the Receiving Yard fits the description "west of Jamaica Station and north of the westbound Montauk." That's why that option is the best answer. The other statements place the yard in positions that don't match one of these two directional cues.

2. In a line graph, the trend from 2018 to 2020 shows increasing values; what does that indicate about the data?

- A. The data remains constant across years.
- B. Data fluctuates with no clear direction.
- C. A rising trend or growth over the period.**
- D. A decline over the period.

Line graphs show how values change over time, and the slope of the line reveals the direction of those changes. If the values rise from 2018 to 2020, the line moves upward, signaling a rising trend or growth over that period. This interpretation fits best because it captures the overall upward movement across the years, rather than suggesting no change, random ups and downs, or a decline. A flat line would mean no change, fluctuations with no clear direction would show a mix of ups and downs, and a downward slope would indicate a decrease.

3. Which yard is located west of Johnson Ave interlocking?

- A. Receiving Yard
- B. E Yard
- C. Johnson Avenue Yard**
- D. Montauk Yard

Understanding how yards relate to interlockings in a rail network helps with this question. An interlocking directs trains safely at a junction, and nearby yards are named for the streets or lines they serve. The yard that carries the Johnson Avenue name is the one positioned on the west side of the Johnson Ave interlocking, making it the correct match for "located west of" that interlocking. The other yards are associated with different areas or lines and don't describe a westward location relative to this interlocking, so they don't fit the specified relationship. If you check a yard map, you'll see Johnson Avenue Yard on the west side of the Johnson Ave interlocking, which confirms why it is the right choice.

4. Where is W/B WHEELHOUSE located at Jamaica station?

A. West end of platform B

B. East end of platform B

C. West end of platform E

D. East end of platform E

Understanding how station signs direct you to important operations spaces helps you locate where the Westbound Wheelhouse is. The "W/B" in the sign stands for Westbound, and the wheelhouse is the control space that oversees westbound train movements. At Jamaica station, this sign is placed at the west end of platform B, which is the side facing the westbound tracks. That positioning makes it the closest and most practical place to monitor and coordinate westbound trains. The east end of platform B would serve the opposite direction, and platform E's ends are associated with other track configurations, so they aren't where this particular wheelhouse is located.

5. Which yard uses signal indications controlled by JCC after permission?

A. Aster (Yard 1)

B. D yard East End

C. E yard

D. D yard West End

Signal indications controlled by the Joint Control Centre after permission mean you must obtain authorization from JCC before the signals will allow movement. Aster yard fits this because its signals are governed by JCC once permission is given. The other yards rely on local control or different procedures, so they don't involve JCC-directed indications after permission.

6. Which statement about inflation is correct?

A. A decrease in prices

B. A sustained rise in the general price level of goods and services

C. A change in the money supply

D. An increase in production efficiency

Inflation is a sustained rise in the general price level of goods and services. Here, "general" means a broad increase across many items, not just one product, and "sustained" means it lasts over time rather than a short-lived spike. This is why the statement fits inflation: it describes a lasting increase in overall prices. While changes in the money supply can influence inflation, inflation itself is defined by rising price levels, not by money supply alone. An increase in production efficiency lowers costs and can reduce prices or boost output, which is opposite to inflation. A decrease in prices describes deflation, not inflation.

7. How are the main tracks numbered?

- A. 1-9 north to south
- B. 0-9 north to south**
- C. 0-9 south to north
- D. 0-9 east to west

Main tracks use a zero-based numbering system, starting at the northernmost track with 0 and increasing as you move south. This makes the reference simple and predictable, especially if a new track is added at the top. So the sequence runs 0, 1, 2, up to 9 from north to south. Using a different starting point, reversing the direction, or applying a different axis would clash with the actual layout and standard references used in the system.

8. East End of Jamaica signals: Eastbound color light low home on the ground is on which track?

- A. track 2
- B. track 12**
- C. track 3
- D. track 9

The key idea is how signals and track routing work together. A ground home signal with a color-light that's in the low (clear) position tells the driver that the route ahead is set for a specific track, and the points are aligned to take you onto that track. In this East End Jamaica layout, the eastbound route tied to that particular ground signal is the track designated for eastbound movements on the diagram. Therefore, when the signal shows the eastbound low home aspect, you proceed onto that specific track—the one allocated for eastbound movements in that signal arrangement. In this case, that track is the one labeled for eastbound use (track 12). The other tracks aren't aligned with this signal's route, so they're not the destination for this signal.

9. What is the measure of the sum of the interior angles of a triangle?

- A. 90 degrees
- B. 180 degrees**
- C. 360 degrees
- D. 45 degrees

The interior angles of a triangle always add up to 180 degrees. One clear way to see this is to extend one side and draw a line parallel to it through the opposite vertex. The other two interior angles become alternate interior angles with angles along that parallel line, and together with the angle at the vertex they lie on a straight line, which totals 180 degrees. This aligns with the general polygon angle-sum formula $(n-2) \times 180$, which for a triangle ($n = 3$) gives 180 degrees. So the total of the three interior angles is 180 degrees, no matter the shape of the triangle. The other options don't represent a sum of three interior angles: 90 degrees is just a single right angle, 360 degrees is a full turn or the sum of exterior angles, and 45 degrees is also just a single angle.

10. What is the signal for track 3 at the West End of Jamaica Signals?

- A. Westbound suspended color light low home (Je)**
- B. Westbound suspended color light low home on the ground
- C. Westbound color light low home (Je)
- D. Westbound color light high home (Je)

Understanding how these signals are described helps you read what each part of the description means: direction of movement, signal type, how it's mounted, and its height. For track 3 at the West End of Jamaica Signals, the description specifies a westbound movement, using a suspended color-light signal mounted at a low height as a home signal (Je for Jamaica). This combination matches the actual equipment at that location, so it's the best fit. The other descriptions imply different setups—signals on the ground, or a high-mounted signal, or a non-suspended type—which don't match the track 3 signal configuration at West End.
