Yes, you can foster the kits of one doe to another. This means that a doe (female rabbit) can raise the young of another doe. While communication, fat storage, and camouflage are important aspects of a rabbit's behavior and biology, they are not the primary functions of large ears like temperature regulation and auditory enhancement are. Understanding these functions is fundamental in learning how rabbits adapt to their environment and ensure their survival.
