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Explanations

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1. Into how many kingdoms did the kingdom divide after Solomon's death?

- A. Two
- B. One
- C. Three
- D. Four

After Solomon's death the united kingdom broke into two separate kingdoms. Jeroboam led the ten northern tribes in rebellion and formed the northern kingdom of Israel, while Rehoboam, Solomon's successor, governed the southern kingdom of Judah from Jerusalem, which included the tribes of Judah and Benjamin. This split created two distinct political entities rather than remaining as one, which is why the correct answer is two kingdoms. (Israel in the north; Judah in the south.) The division is a key event in biblical history and helps explain subsequent histories of both kingdoms.

2. On the road to Damascus, who appeared to Saul?

- A. An angel
- B. Moses
- C. Jesus Christ
- D. Peter

Jesus appeared to Saul on the road to Damascus. A brilliant light from heaven surrounded him, and a voice spoke, identifying the speaker as Jesus and addressing Saul personally. This encounter marks Saul's conversion and his call to become Paul, the missionary to the Gentiles. It shows Jesus is alive and actively involved with his followers. The account makes clear it is Jesus who appeared, not an angel, nor Moses, nor Peter.

3. Into what country was Joseph sold as a slave?

- A. Canaan
- B. Egypt
- C. Mesopotamia
- D. Greece

The idea being tested is where Joseph ends up after his brothers sell him, which sets the course for the rest of his story. He is sold to traveling traders and taken to Egypt, not staying in Canaan or going to Mesopotamia or Greece. This destination matters because it explains why the narrative moves to Pharaoh's house and how, later on, Israel's family ends up in Egypt during a famine. The Egypt setting is why the rest of Joseph's story unfolds the way it does.

4. Which Old Testament prophet foretold the outpouring of the Holy Spirit?

- A. Joel
- B. Isaiah
- C. Jeremiah
- D. Ezekiel

The idea being tested is who predicted a widespread outpouring of God's Spirit. Joel is the prophet who makes this specific forecast in the latter days, describing God pouring out his Spirit on all people—young and old, male and female—leading to widespread prophecy, dreams, and visions. This promise is repeatedly linked to Pentecost in the New Testament when Peter quotes Joel to explain the event of the Spirit coming upon believers. Other prophets speak about the Spirit in meaningful ways—Isaiah speaks of the Spirit resting on God's Anointed and guiding His people, Ezekiel speaks of a new heart and Spirit given to enable obedience, and Jeremiah talks about the New Covenant role of the Spirit in writing God's law on hearts. But Joel's message is the clearest and most direct forecast of a universal, dramatic outpouring of the Spirit in the last days, which is why it's the best answer.

5. Who was Joseph's first master in Egypt?

- A. The captain of the guard
- B. Pharaoh
- C. Potiphar
- D. Potiphar's wife

Joseph's first master in Egypt was Potiphar, an Egyptian official who, in the Bible, is described as captain of the guard for Pharaoh. When Joseph was brought to Egypt, Potiphar bought him and put him in charge of his household because God caused Joseph to prosper in everything he did. So Potiphar is the initial master; the title captain of the guard refers to Potiphar's role, not a separate master. Pharaoh later elevated Joseph after he interpreted dreams, but that came after his service under Potiphar. Potiphar's wife isn't a master; she's the one who falsely accused Joseph, leading to his imprisonment.

6. Which companion is often associated with Paul on later travels and is listed along with Silas?

- A. Barnabas
- B. Timothy
- C. Luke
- D. John Mark

Timothy is the companion closely linked with Paul on his later travels and is regularly named alongside Silas in Paul's team. He joined Paul during the second missionary journey and grew into a trusted co-worker who accompanied Paul on mission trips. In Paul's letters, greetings often mention Paul, Silas, and Timothy together, showing that Timothy was part of the ongoing travels with Silas and the broader mission team. This combination—Timothy traveling with Paul and Silas—fits the description in the question, making Timothy the best answer.

7. In the story of Naaman, which river did he wash in to be healed?

- A. Nile River
- B. Euphrates River
- C. Tigris River
- D. Jordan River**

Naaman's healing comes from obeying the specific instruction given by the prophet: wash seven times in the Jordan River. He initially resists, thinking there should be a more impressive or noble method, but the turning point is choosing to follow the instruction anyway. After he dips in the Jordan seven times, his flesh is cleansed of the disease. The Jordan River is the setting for this cleansing, not the Nile, Euphrates, or Tigris. This story highlights faith and obedience—God works through the prophet's command, not through pride or fancy rituals.

8. In the feeding of the 5,000, how many loaves and fish were used?

- A. Three loaves and five fish
- B. Five loaves and two fish**
- C. One loaf and ten fish
- D. Seven loaves and three fish

The amount described in the miracle is five loaves and two fish. In the feeding of the 5,000, Jesus took five loaves and two fish, blessed them, and they multiplied to feed the crowd with leftovers. That exact detail—not any other numbers—is why this option is correct. The other choices don't fit what the gospel records, which state five loaves and two fish, sometimes noted as five barley loaves and two small fish.

9. In Ephesians, what command does Paul give to the children?

- A. Children, obey your parents.**
- B. Children, honor your parents.
- C. Parents, obey your children.
- D. Children, listen to your teachers.

Children should obey their parents, because Paul presents this as the direct instruction to children within the Christian home: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right." The phrase "in the Lord" shows that this obedience is to be grounded in living under Christ's authority and for His purposes, not as a mere social rule. This fits into the family relations section in Ephesians, where Paul outlines how a Christian home should reflect order and love. While honoring parents is a related biblical principle and appears elsewhere in Scripture, the specific directive given to children in this passage is obedience. The other options don't match the exact command Paul gives to children in this context.

10. What gifts were given to Jesus by the Wise Men?

- A. Gold and incense
- B. Myrrh and incense
- C. Gold, myrrh, and spices
- D. Gold, frankincense, myrrh**

The gifts show recognition of who Jesus is and what his life would involve. Gold points to his kingship—as the true King who would reign over God's people. Frankincense, a substance used in worship and temple rites, speaks of his divine nature and his role in mediation, worthy of worship. Myrrh, an embalming spice, foreshadows the suffering and death he would undergo. The biblical account describes the Wise Men bringing these three gifts to the child in Bethlehem, underscoring these three aspects of his identity and mission. Other options miss one of the gifts or replace it with a different item, so they don't align as closely with the message conveyed by the scene. Therefore, the combination of gold, frankincense, and myrrh best fits the story.
