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Explanations

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1. What happens when we long for pure spiritual milk?

Longing for pure spiritual milk is about craving nourishing truths that feed faith. When you earnestly desire this pure nourishment, you're seeking the reliable Word and spiritual teaching that help a believer grow. Then evaluating the supporting evidence—data, examples, reasons, and trade-offs—lets you judge how strong the claim is and whether the proposed policy really holds up under scrutiny. The other options don't target the core argument: counting graphs shows data rather than the main claim, reading only the introduction may miss the full argument, and relying on memory doesn't engage with the text to verify its claims.

The following action—Putting the hand back in and withdrawing it again, restoring it to normal—demonstrates that God can both afflict and heal, reinforcing the messenger's credibility.

The imagery also fits the description of those following him as clothed in fine linen, white and clean, symbolizing the righteousness of the saints and angels united in his return. That makes the armies of heaven the best fit for who follows. Other groups mentioned in Revelation—like the apostles, the elders of Israel, or the beasts from the sea—appear in different parts of the vision and are not described as following the rider in this moment.
