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Explanations

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1. What term describes behavior that involves repeating the same actions to the same stimulus without change?

Habit(uation) refers to a form of learning in which an organism becomes accustomed to a stimulus after repeated exposure, leading to a decrease in response to that stimulus over time. This concept implies that the behavior is repetitive and shows a consistent reaction without significant change, as the organism learns that the stimulus is harmless or unimportant. In the context of this question, habit(uation) captures the essence of repeating the same actions in response to a constant stimulus, as it emphasizes the idea of the behavior becoming automatic or less pronounced due to familiarity. A theory represents a well-substantiated explanation of an aspect of the natural world that has been repeatedly tested and confirmed through observation and experimentation, but it is not merely an educated guess. A conclusion is the result of analyzing the data collected during an experiment, determining the validity of the hypothesis. Thus, the nature of a hypothesis as a tentative statement that can be directly tested is what makes it the correct answer.
