The President of the United States resides in The White House, which serves as the official residence and workplace. Located at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue NW in Washington, D.C., The White House has been the residence of every U.S. president since John Adams in 1800. It is not only a home but also a symbol of the U.S. presidency and federal government. The Capitol is the seat of the United States Congress and serves as the political center for legislative activities, but it is not where the president lives. Camp David is a country retreat for the president and a place for informal meetings, rather than the primary residence. Blair House is an official guest house for foreign dignitaries visiting the president, but it too is not where the president resides. Therefore, The White House is the correct choice as the residence of the President of the United States.

In contrast, temperatures such as 90, 110, and 120 degrees Celsius are not the boiling point of water under normal conditions. At these temperatures, water would either not be boiling yet (at 90 degrees) or is already in a gaseous state (at 110 and 120 degrees). Understanding the boiling point of water is essential, as it serves as a fundamental concept in various scientific calculations and applications, including cooking and meteorology.

Understanding that Ottawa serves as the seat of government helps clarify its status as the capital, while other cities like Toronto, Vancouver, and Montreal, though they are major urban centers and culturally vibrant cities, do not serve as the political capital. Toronto is the largest city in Canada and is known for its financial district, while Vancouver is renowned for its scenic beauty and as a gateway to the Pacific. Montreal is famous for its rich history and French-speaking population, but none of these cities hold the political significance that Ottawa does as the capital of the country.

Milan is a major financial and fashion hub in Italy, yet it also does not hold the status of the capital city. Thus, Rome's combination of historical, cultural, and political significance makes it the correct answer.
