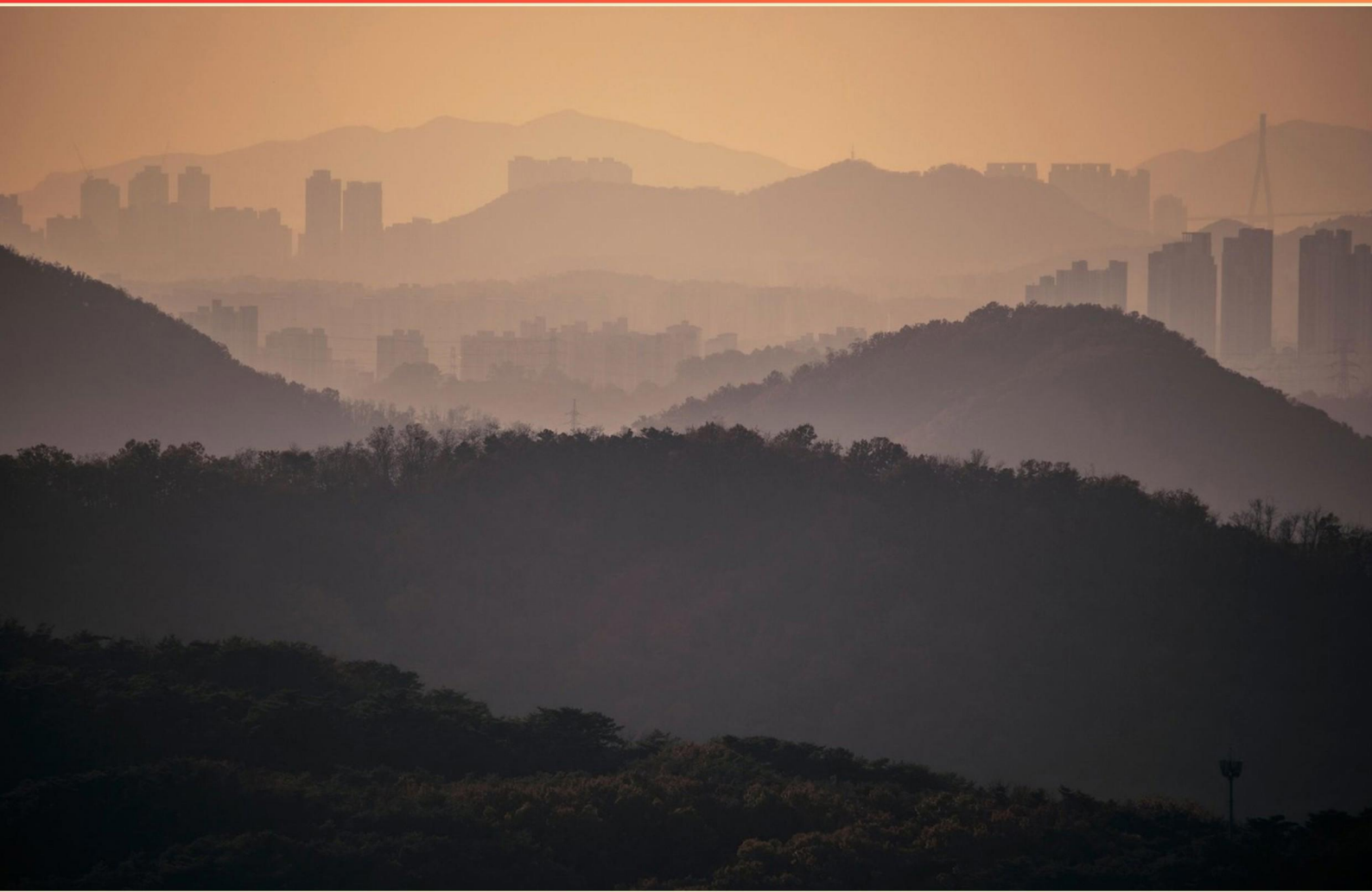

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Explanations

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1. What is the first day of the Korean lunar calendar called?

- A. Seollal**

Seollal marks the first day of the Korean lunar calendar, the Lunar New Year. It's Korea's most important traditional holiday and signals the start of a new lunar year. Families gather, perform ancestral rites, bow to elders, wear hanbok, and eat tteokguk (rice cake soup). There's a common belief that eating tteokguk adds a year to one's age, which is part of the cultural meaning attached to Seollal. The other events listed are separate: Dano occurs on the fifth day of the fifth lunar month; Gaecheonjeol commemorates Korea's founding; Hangul Day celebrates the invention of the Korean alphabet.

Distributing Scripture and building a local church under harsh restrictions defines the early Protestant mission in Korea. Robert Jermain Thomas stands out as the missionary linked to bringing Bibles into Korea and is remembered as a martyr for his death during the Joseon crackdown on Christians. He worked to place Protestant Scripture in Korean hands, and his sacrifice helped seed the growth of the Korean Protestant church that followed. The other missionaries contributed in different ways—education, medicine, or later scholarship—rather than being primarily associated with Bible distribution and martyrdom.

At the heart of late Joseon uprisings is the basic link between hardship and anger at those in power. Recurrent famines and natural disasters collapsed harvests, while heavy taxes and corvée obligations pressed peasants into debt and poverty. Widespread corruption among local officials and officials' failure to provide relief intensified grievances, making resistance feel both justified and necessary. While religious reform movements like the Donghak movement did emerge and influence events, the driving force behind the uprisings was economic distress and corrupt governance, not a purely religious or externally started movement. Foreign influence did exist in the era, but the impulse for these revolts came from domestic conditions and the perception that the state could not protect or support the peasantry.

It served as a bridge between Korean expatriates and the broader independence activities, coordinating recruitment, fundraising, and support that could back efforts back home and in neighboring regions. This focus on gathering supporters in the United States sets it apart from the other options: the Righteous Army were local militias inside Korea; the Provisional Government was a government-in-exile established in Shanghai; and the Korean Liberation Army was the armed force organized later under that government.

The idea being tested is which activities are considered part of the knowledge-based, information-driven quaternary sector. This sector focuses on creating, processing, and disseminating knowledge and ideas, often through professional services that rely on specialized expertise. Consultation, education, and financial planning all revolve around applying specialized knowledge to help others make decisions, improve processes, or plan for the future. They're driven by analysis, research, and the handling of information, which is why they fit squarely in the quaternary category. Banking, on the other hand, is centered on financial intermediation: handling money, lending, payments, and risk management. While it uses knowledge, its core function is transactional and capital-allocating services rather than producing new knowledge. That's why it's classified as a tertiary service rather than quaternary.

Knowing which island in South Korea has the largest area is what this question tests. Jeju Island sits off the southern coast and is the largest by land area, roughly 1,850 square kilometers, larger than any other Korean island. Its size, along with its unique volcanic origin and Hallasan peak, makes it stand out as the top island in the country. So the statement is true. The other options would imply different positions or uncertainty, but the established fact is that Jeju Island is the largest by area.

The main idea here is recognizing what counts as a primary economic activity. Primary activities are those that draw resources directly from nature—things like farming, forestry, and mining. In North Korea, the economy has long centered on direct resource extraction and agricultural output: coal mining is a clear example of extracting minerals, and agriculture and forestry are the foundational, direct-producing activities. Oil refining, by contrast, is a processing step. It converts crude oil into usable fuels and products, which makes it part of the processing or industrial sector rather than the direct extraction or production of resources themselves. Since it relies on importing crude oil and focuses on turning inputs into finished products, it doesn't sit in the primary category. That's why oil refining is the choice that isn't considered a primary economic sector for North Korea.

Administrative work—the day-to-day running of government agencies, implementing regulations, and delivering public services—belongs to the civil service and regulatory bodies within that system. These agencies operate under the authority of the executive and are subject to oversight and checks from the other branches, but they don't form a separate constitutional branch with independent power to legislate, adjudicate, or command. So, administrative describes the bureaucracy, not a primary branch with its own constitutional powers.

That exposure helps boost interest and demand for K-Beauty products beyond Korea, turning it into a global phenomenon. So, the statement that K-Beauty became globally popular as a result of other Hallyu contents captures this spillover mechanism: entertainment content drives curiosity and consumption in related product categories, spreading Korean beauty trends across borders. While K-Pop can influence fashion and other areas, the clearest illustrated ripple here is how Hallyu content helps propel K-Beauty onto the world stage.
