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Explanations

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1. Which word captures the meaning of being genuine?

Being genuine means real, true, and not fake. The word that best captures this sense is authentic. When you describe something as authentic, you're saying it is true to its origin, credible, and not counterfeit. This can apply to people who are sincere and honest, or to objects and statements that are truly what they claim to be. The other options don't fit because they refer to actions (stumble upon), a profession (astronomer), or a state of being stuck (wedged), none of which convey the idea of genuineness.

The key idea is naming the profession of someone who studies celestial bodies. The other options don't relate to this field at all—one means genuine, another means to find by chance, and the last describes something stuck. So this term best identifies the professional who studies celestial bodies.

Finding a word that expresses moral character. Noble is the term that best captures someone who acts with high moral standards, integrity, and honor. So noble is the right choice because it directly conveys being honorable.

A burn-down chart shows how much work remains as time passes. In Mega Goal tracking, it helps you see whether you're on track to finish the large objective by the deadline. The main idea here is using SMART to turn a Mega Goal into a clear, actionable plan. SMART stands for Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-bound. Each part helps ensure the goal is well-defined and doable. Specific means the goal states exactly what is to be achieved. Measurable adds a way to track progress and know when the goal is reached. Achievable focuses on feasibility given resources and constraints. Relevant ensures the goal matters in the bigger picture and aligns with broader aims. Time-bound sets a deadline or timeframe to create urgency and keep progress moving. The set with Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, Time-bound matches this standard wording and structure. Other options mix in terms like Simple, Marketable, Actionable, or Adaptable and Trackable, which aren't the conventional SMART terms, so they don't align with the familiar framework.

It isn't about forcing overtime or ignoring risk management, and it doesn't lock in fixed delivery dates if resources can't support them. By balancing demand with capacity, you end up with a realistic, achievable plan.

This keeps the project aligned with its goals and updated plans. Baselining only at the end is too late to catch changes; signing off after completion doesn't prevent midcourse changes; and avoiding acceptance criteria leaves ambiguity that invites additional requests. By enforcing change control, you ensure every change is intentional and understood in terms of cost, time, and value.

Mapping dependencies and ordering tasks shows how work must flow, which shapes a realistic project schedule. When tasks are properly sequenced, you reveal the critical path—the longest chain of dependent activities that determines the project's finish date. Keeping work aligned so each task starts as soon as its predecessors end minimizes waits, so progress stays on track. This focus helps prevent delays from cascading, and it also highlights slack on non-critical tasks, allowing parallel work and better resource use. The practical outcome is timely progression and fewer delays along the main route that drives the finish date.

The idea tested is how to express that something changes or is not the same. The best fit is to vary. Vary means to differ or change in form, amount, or degree. It captures the sense that things aren't fixed and can take on different appearances or values. For example, the colors on the fabric can vary, meaning some pieces look different from others. Opinions on the plan may vary, indicating there isn't one uniform view. Emerge means to come into view or become visible. Standards are established norms or criteria. Brilliant describes something very bright or exceptionally clever. These others don't convey the sense of changing or being different in form the way vary does.

10. In a stakeholder influence map, which two dimensions are most commonly represented?

Stakeholder influence maps are built around two axes: influence (power to affect the project) and interest (level of stake or concern in the project's outcomes). Placing stakeholders on this grid helps you see who must be engaged closely versus who can be kept satisfied or informed with lighter touch. High influence and high interest stakeholders require ongoing, strategic engagement; those with high influence but low interest should be managed to stay satisfied; those with low influence but high interest should be kept informed; and low influence with low interest may need minimal effort. This focus on power and concern makes sense because it directly informs how to allocate communication and engagement resources, unlike options that mix in cost, schedule, security, or expertise, which relate to other aspects of project planning.
