The other options do not directly relate to the purpose of Site Templates. Device detection capabilities are generally handled by theme and layout settings rather than site templates. Adjustments to user permissions are typically managed through the user roles and permissions settings within the portal, and in-depth analytics reports rely on data gathered from various actions across the sites rather than on the parameters set by Site Templates.
