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Explanations

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1. Which street corresponds to the designation of 3200 West?

- A. Cicero Ave
- B. Kedzie Ave**

The designation of 3200 West refers to a specific point in a grid system used in urban areas, particularly in Chicago. This spatial relationship plays a crucial role in both daily commutes and broader urban development discussions in the region. Understanding directions in relation to major cities also aids in mapping and logistical planning, as well as in the study of urban sprawl and suburban growth patterns.
