1. The phrase 'kämpfen, mühe haben, ringen' translates to which English verb?

- A. To Struggle**
- B. To Triumph**
- C. To Drift**
- D. To Meditate**

These phrases carry the sense of fighting, making a strong effort, and having trouble. The natural English verb that covers all these nuances is "to struggle." It capturing both actively fighting or grappling with something and experiencing difficulty or effort. Saying "to triumph" implies winning, which isn't the sense here. "To drift" suggests moving without direction, not effort or fighting. "To meditate" is about deep thinking or contemplation, not dealing with a challenge. So the best translation is "to struggle." For example, "kämpfen mit einem Problem" → "to struggle with a problem," "Mühe haben" → "to have difficulties," "ringen" → "to wrestle/struggle with."

2. Which term describes the presence of differences within a group?

- A. Equality**

The main concept is recognizing the variety that exists within a group. Diversity describes the presence of differences in backgrounds, identities, experiences, cultures, abilities, perspectives, and more among people in the same group. This variety can enrich discussions, problem-solving, and collaboration because different viewpoints bring new insights. The other terms address related ideas but not the existence of differences themselves: equality focuses on giving everyone the same resources or opportunities; equity aims to tailor resources to different needs to achieve fair outcomes; awareness means simply knowing that differences exist. So the term that best describes the presence of differences within a group is diversity.

3. Which English noun translates alliierte, verbündete?

This tests vocabulary for a partner on your side in a coalition. Alliierte and verbündete describe someone or a group that is allied with you. In English, the noun that best captures this relationship is ally — a person or country that cooperates with you toward a common goal. The plural form would be allies when referring to more than one partner. The other options don't fit because they describe different relationships: an enemy is opposed to you, a stranger is someone you don't know, and a neighbor is someone who lives nearby.

4. Which term translates the German 'Behinderung'?

Disability is the natural English translation of Behinderung. It refers to a physical or mental limitation that affects how a person functions, and it's the term used in discussions about accessibility and rights. The other concepts describe different ideas: ability denotes capacity or skill, equality focuses on fair treatment, and diversity means variety. None of those capture the specific sense of a limitation that Behinderung conveys. For example, Eine Behinderung = a disability.

5. Which English verb means 'to clash' or 'to collide'?

The main idea here is choosing a verb that directly conveys two things meeting and hitting each other, or two forces or ideas coming into strong conflict. The word that does this literally is to clash, since it describes objects or forces colliding or situations where there's a strong clash of ideas, colors, or styles. Among the options, this one matches the meaning most closely because it carries the sense of physical collision as well as a metaphorical conflict. The other verbs describe different actions—exchanging is giving and receiving; arguing is about verbal disagreement; committing is about performing or dedicating something. So the verb that means to clash or collide is to clash.

6. Which verb means to acknowledge the validity or importance of something?

- A. To Recognize**

Acknowledging the value or validity of something means admitting that it has real worth or importance and giving it appropriate recognition. The verb that best captures this idea is recognize. When you recognize something, you accept its legitimacy or significance and may give it attention or credit. The other verbs describe opposite actions: overlook means to miss or ignore something, forget means to fail to remember it, and dismiss means to reject or downplay it. For example, we recognize the contributions of volunteers, which shows we acknowledge their value.

7. In a political or organizational context, the act of presenting information about a group to others is called which term?

- A. Representation**

Representation is about presenting information about a group to others. In political or organizational settings, a representative conveys the group's views, interests, and policies to decision-makers, the public, or other groups, effectively acting on behalf of the group. This distinguishes it from delegation (passing tasks to others), leadership (guiding and motivating people), or administration (managing daily operations).

8. What term corresponds to 'Gleichberechtigung'?

Gleichberechtigung refers to having equal rights and equal status for everyone, ensuring the same opportunities and protections under law regardless of gender or background. That focus on sameness in rights and treatment is captured by Equality. Equity, in contrast, emphasizes fairness by sometimes providing different resources to reach equal outcomes. Diversity is about variety among people, and awareness means knowledge of social issues.

9. Which English word best translates Aktivismus as a noun?

This tests choosing the English noun that captures the idea of organized advocacy for change. Aktivismus refers to the practice or movement of working to influence social or political goals. The best English equivalent is activism because it names the phenomenon itself—the sustained effort and collective action to bring about change. It isn't activity, which is a generic word for doing something; it isn't a person, which would be an activist; and it isn't an adjective like active, which describes being engaged but not the movement or practice. You'll often see phrases like environmental activism or student activism, which illustrate how activism stands for the whole movement or activity of advocating for a cause.

10. The German 'Beziehung, Verhaeltnis' translates to which English word?

A. Relationship

B. Sex

C. Orientation

D. Marriage

Understanding how Beziehung and Verhältnis express a connection between people in English helps you pick the right translation. These German nouns describe a link or bond between individuals or entities, and the natural English word for that sense is relationship. It covers friendships, family ties, romantic partnerships, or how two people relate to each other, not just romantic or official statuses. That's why relationship is the best fit here. The other options refer to different ideas: sex relates to biological sex or sexual activity, orientation refers to sexual orientation in most contexts, and marriage points to a formal institution rather than a general connection.
