SAMPLE

1. Which German phrase is translated as 'Relationship'?

- A. Beziehung, Verhaeltnis**
- B. Besessen sein**

The main idea is choosing the German word that matches the general idea of a “relationship.” In German, the direct translation for relationship is Be—ziehung. This word covers relationships between people—romantic, familial, or social—as well as the state or quality of that connection. You’ll hear phrases like eine gute Beziehung (a good relationship) or in einer Beziehung sein (to be in a relationship). Verhältnis can also mean relationship, but it’s used more for how things relate to each other or in more formal or specific contexts, and it can also mean ratio. That nuance is why Be—ziehung is the best match for the general term “relationship,” while Verhältnis appears as a related but different usage. The other options don’t fit: Besessen sein means to be obsessed, Ehe, Heirat means marriage, and Pansexuell means pansexual.

Acknowledging the value or validity of something means admitting that it has real worth or importance and giving it appropriate recognition. The verb that best captures this idea is recognize. When you recognize something, you accept its legitimacy or significance and may give it attention or credit. The other verbs describe opposite actions: overlook means to miss or ignore something, forget means to fail to remember it, and dismiss means to reject or downplay it. For example, we recognize the contributions of volunteers, which shows we acknowledge their value.

Gender can be experienced as fluid, not fixed to one binary category. Genderfluid describes someone whose sense of gender shifts over time or in different contexts, so they may feel male at some moments, female at others, or somewhere between or outside these labels. That idea of movement and variability directly matches the notion of not strictly adhering to male or female. For context, other terms describe different relationships to the binary: cisgender means your gender matches your birth sex, transgender means your gender differs from your birth sex, and nonbinary is a broad umbrella for identities beyond just male or female. But genderfluid specifically highlights the changing, non-fixed aspect of gender.

The essential idea is how to express inviting someone to share a date in English. The natural idiom is to ask someone out, meaning you extend the invitation for a date. This focuses on the act of proposing the outing itself, which is exactly what the German expression conveys. Saying someone is invited on a date is understandable but not the common way to express it in English; it sounds less idiomatic. A ride-along meaning (pick someone up) describes picking them up, not inviting them; and going out with someone describes a dating relationship rather than making the invitation. A typical usage would be, "Would you like to go out with me?" or "I'd like to ask you out."

5. The term 'Sexuelle Veranlagerung' translates to which English word?

Sexual orientation is about how a person's sexual attractions are oriented toward others. The German phrase combines sexual with a sense of predisposition or inclination, so the natural English translation is sexual orientation—the pattern of who someone is attracted to (for sexual and romantic purposes) across their life. This fits best because it distinguishes attraction from other ideas: sex refers to biological characteristics, not whom someone is attracted to; a relationship is about the connection between people, not the direction of attraction; and romantic describes a type of attraction that can be separate from sexual attraction. Since the term in question specifically conveys the direction of sexual attraction, sexual orientation is the accurate translation.

6. The English adjective corresponding to 'Spannung' when used descriptively describes which state?

Spannung describes a state of mental or emotional strain—being on edge, worried, or anticipating something. When used to describe a person, the English adjective that best matches that sense is nervous, since nervous conveys that feeling of unease or apprehension. The other options don't fit because calm and relaxed are the opposite of being tense, and joyful doesn't capture the sense of tension or worry implied by Spannung. For example, someone feeling Spannung about a test would be described as nervous in English.

7. In the material, the two German terms are associated with which single English phrase?

The main idea being tested is how racism is described as something that operates through the whole system, not just in isolated acts. The two German terms in the material point to racism that is embedded in the way policies, institutions, and everyday practices run across society. That kind of pervasive, system-wide influence is captured by the English phrase systemic racism. It conveys that discrimination shows up in laws, school funding, policing, housing, employment, and other structures in ways that create unequal outcomes for different racial groups, even when individuals don't intend harm. Personal racism focuses on individual attitudes or actions, and cultural racism centers on beliefs about culture, neither of which fully captures how the whole system perpetuates inequality. Structural racism is very close in sense, but the material's pairing aligns more precisely with the systemic view, emphasizing the interconnected systems and institutions that collectively sustain disparities.

8. The verb 'unterdrücken' translates to which English verb?

Understanding how unterdrücken is translated into English. This verb carries the sense of using power to keep someone down or to restrict their freedoms, a coercive control over others. That makes "to oppress" the best fit among the options. For example, Die Regierung unterdrückt die Presse means The government oppresses the press. The other options don't match this sense: to support means to help or back someone, which is the opposite of restricting; to liberate means to free, not restrict; to ignore means to pay no attention, which misses the issue of power and control.

9. The phrase 'kämpfen, mühe haben, ringen' translates to which English verb?

A. To Struggle

B. To Triumph

C. To Drift

D. To Meditate

These phrases carry the sense of fighting, making a strong effort, and having trouble. The natural English verb that covers all these nuances is "to struggle." It captures both actively fighting or grappling with something and experiencing difficulty or effort. Saying "to triumph" implies winning, which isn't the sense here. "To drift" suggests moving without direction, not effort or fighting. "To meditate" is about deep thinking or contemplation, not dealing with a challenge. So the best translation is "to struggle." For example, "kämpfen mit einem Problem" → "to struggle with a problem," "Mühe haben" → "to have difficulties," "ringen" → "to wrestle/struggle with."

10. The word 'Ungerechtigkeit' is best translated as which English noun?

- A. Injustice**

Ungerechtigkeit expresses a wrongness in how someone is treated or in a situation that violates what is morally or legally just. The natural English noun for that idea is **injustice**, used to talk about unfair treatment, denied rights, or outcomes that go against what is right. Equality is about sameness and rights, not the wrongness itself. Fairness is a related positive idea about how rules should be applied, but it doesn't name the wrong that has occurred. Inequity is a close, more formal term for an unfair difference or imbalance, but the everyday translation of Ungerechtigkeit is **injustice**. So in most contexts, Ungerechtigkeit = injustice, as in "There is injustice in this system."
